


AUDACITY

There is a spirit of audacity in our readings today. During a time of injustice and threat of invasion, the prophet Micah boldly announces that the God of insignificant Israel will raise up a leader from backwater Bethlehem, and this leader will bring justice and peace to the whole world. In the Gospel, Elizabeth and *Mary, marginalized women, brazenly* celebrate that their sons will be worldchanging instruments of God. We further learn that this audacity is rooted in trust in God. The author of Hebrews describes the faithful obedience of Jesus. Mary is shown as the exemplar of faithful trust in God. This is the way God often seems to work, in the ordinary and marginalized in our world. Those who seem weak have learned to trust in God's strength. These have the audacity to become instruments of God's peace and justice.

It's funny how your perspective changes as you get older. When I was young, Advent always seemed so, so long. Christmas would never get here, and the



We briefly considered the prophet Baruch, whom we seldom hear from, but we haven't had the time to talk about Zephaniah or Micah, whom we've heard from the last two weeks and who are equally obscure. We considered the entrance antiphon from week three, but we don't have time to talk about this week's: *Rorate Caeli*, "Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Savior." Nor have we considered some of the great saints we've celebrated or will celebrate during Advent: Andrew, Francis Xavier, Ambrose, Lucy, Juan Diego, and John of the Cross, just to name a few. Worse, we haven't had time to talk about the great Marian feasts of Advent: the Immaculate Conception, Our Lady of Loreto, and Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Clearly, Advent has to be longer. That's not going to happen, but what can happen is that we can change ourselves. In these waning days of Advent, it is useful to reflect on Mary and Joseph as they journey towards Bethlehem. The roads are crowded with all sorts of people, each heading to their hometown for the census. Some are happy to do so, some are rather cranky about it. There's congestion. There's noise. And there's the added complication that Mary is very pregnant at this point. She's got to be tired and uncomfortable, and surely both she and Joseph are worried. But both have received messages from God; Joseph in a dream and Mary from the archangel Gabriel, and the context of the message was the same: do not be afraid. God is with them on this journey, and He will not abandon them.

So perhaps our Advent has not been as perfect as we would have liked. Maybe we feel like we could have done more to prepare spiritually. But this is not a time to worry or panic. This is not the time to be afraid. Let us use these last days of Advent to ponder in our hearts what God is speaking to us; to ponder what He is calling us to. Make it a priority in these last days to find some time specifically for prayer, especially as a family. Like Mary and Joseph, may we always make a radical gift of ourselves to God.


Remember to pray for all those who are suffering physically, spiritually and mentally. May their faith sustain them and may God's presence comfort and lift them.




Gospel: Luke 1:39-45


