We Have a New Bishop! Please join me in congratulating and praying for Bishop Mark Eckman as he prepares to begin his new and great responsibility as our Diocesan Bishop! I have been blessed to know Bishop Eckman since I was in high school. When you are ordained a deacon, you place your hands in the hands of the bishop and promise your obedience to the bishop and his successors without knowing who they will be. It is a true act of trust in the Providence of God. In a particular and personal way, the diocesan bishop is the presence of the apostles in a place. I am grateful to get to continue living my promise of priestly obedience with Bishop Eckman. He will need our prayers as he prepares for his installation on July 14 and beyond.

We Have New Deacons! Congratulations to Deacons Nick Wytiaz and Bryan Myler! I write this in advance of the ordinations, but I hope many of you were able to be there. Please pray for them and their classmates as they continue their preparation for the Holy Priesthood as deacons. Also, please continue to pray for vocations to the priesthood!

We Have a New High School Youth Minister! If you joined us for Mass last Sunday, you got to meet her or at least heard her introduce herself. We were praying that God would send us a good candidate to assist in the adventure of our high school students on their journey of faith. God answered our prayers! Celena Colcombe will need our prayers and support to do her work well. I would invite parents of high school students to encourage your children to participate in our program. I also want to encourage those who might feel called to be on the core team to reach out to Celena.

There will be three key adjustments that I hope will enhance our program this year:

1. It will be for 9th–12th grade (it formerly included 7th and 8th grade, who will have a different catechetical path this year).
2. It will be on Sunday evening, which is largely considered a more workable night for high school students.
3. It will be every week, so continuity and community can grow.

June: Month of the Sacred Heart— June is the month the Church dedicates to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the burning indication of God's love for us. One of the great gifts our late Pope Francis gave us during his pontificate was an encyclical devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus called *Dilexit Nos* — “He Loved Us.”

I give you two quotes from that document:

“In a world where everything is bought and sold, people's sense of their worth appears increasingly to depend on what they can accumulate with the power of money. We are constantly being pushed to keep buying, consuming, and distracting ourselves, held captive to a demeaning system that prevents us from looking beyond our immediate and petty needs. The love of Christ has no place in this perverse mechanism, yet only that love can set us free from a mad pursuit that no longer has room for a gratuitous love. Christ's love can give a heart to our world and revive love wherever we think that the ability to love has been definitively lost.”

“The wounded side of Christ continues to pour forth that stream which is never exhausted, never passes away, but offers itself time and time again to all those who wish to love as he did. For his love alone can bring about a new humanity.”

I pray these words will help you love Jesus and others well as you experience His love during this month of June.

Thank You for Your Prayers! I am grateful for your prayers for my pilgrimage to Greece. So good to be back! It was a very beautiful, intense, and spiritually fruitful journey. You were in my intentions for all of the Masses we celebrated on the trip.

Meet our New Youth Minister



Hello! I am Celena Colcombe, and I am beyond excited to be the new high school youth minister here at Christ the Divine Shepherd Parish! I graduated in May from Saint Vincent College with degrees in both psychology and theology. In addition to doing ministry, I am a licensed cosmetologist, and I have been working at a salon as a hairdresser for the past 5 years in North Huntingdon where I live. At the salon, I will often say that my chair is a sacred space where I hear about my clients' lives each with varying life experiences. It is due to this unique setting that I can engage with the modern world from behind a styling chair where I have developed a comprehensive outlook on people, leading me to studying both psychology and theology at Saint Vincent College. I desire to have a holistic approach to ministry as I walk with the youth in their spiritual and psychological

journey during their high school years that are often filled with much confusion and difficulties.

During my teens I had a positive and life changing experience participating in high school youth ministry. I encountered Jesus in a deeply personal way, and He gave my life meaning and hope. I would not be the woman I am today if it were not for my high school youth group where I met some of my closest friends and I came to understand that I am a beloved daughter of Our Lord. High school is rough. Youth group was my saving grace each week where I was replenished as I grew in my faith and enjoyed fulfilling fellowship all while having fun. Attending retreats, conferences, and mission trips only furthered my love of Christ and His people. Soon I realized I had a tug on my heart from the Lord to participate in the ministry that was so vital to my own formation. Upon high school graduation I volunteered to be a part of the core team of adults that helped to facilitate youth ministry. Then, in the following summers I became the intern youth minister as I led the summer events. At Saint Vincent College, I was blessed to be an active member in campus ministry growing deeper in my relationship with Christ. These experiences solidified my love of ministry and my desire to accompany teens as they come to know Christ.

Taking my own time in high school youth ministry, the formative experiences from the salon, my experiences working in ministry, and my Benedictine education from Saint Vincent College, I want to create a space here at Christ the Divine Shepherd Parish where teens can be part of a community that welcomes them, loves them, and accompanies them on their faith journey. My vision for high school youth ministry is to provide teens with quality fellowship, fun, and foster spiritual growth. Youth ministry is a place where high schoolers can enjoy sports nights, engage in friendly competition through various games, develop deep friendships, all while learning about scripture, diving into the rich truths of our Catholic faith, and learning how to live virtuous lives as young people in the current culture. I want the teens of our parish to thrive in their identity as a son or daughter of Christ and know in their heart what it means to be uniquely and personally loved by God. My primary role is to walk with teens to a place where they can encounter Christ and assist them as they understand the ramifications the radical truth of His love has on their lives. It is against the culture to be a young person of faith in our world today. I feel that the loneliness and restlessness that the youth often feel within themselves points to the reality that things are not as they should be and there is something greater, *someone* greater who calls us to Himself.

Youth Ministry

There is the saying that “it takes a village to raise a child”, well I feel that it takes the *whole parish* to have a thriving youth ministry program. So, I would like to ask the parishioners to prayerfully discern how you can assist the youth of our parish whether you can give of your time to be a part of our core team of adults helping with logistics, participating in activities with the teens, or leading small group discussions when we hold our weekly Sunday night meetings during the school year. Or, if you own a business perhaps you would be willing to sponsor some of our activities. Jesus continually shows us in the Gospels His concern for both the spiritual and physical nourishment of His disciples, likewise our hungry growing teens need to be fed so maybe you would consider donating snacks to our program. I ask parents and grandparents to encourage the teens in your life to join the youth ministry community and support them by making the needed sacrifices to add youth ministry to the family schedule. I am 1 of 4 siblings and I understand just how busy family life can get, between the dance classes, track meets, theater rehearsals, family events, and whatever else was thrown into the mix of varied activities. I know that my siblings and I are deeply appreciative of the sacrifices and love our parents showed us by making our faith nourishment a priority and taking us to youth ministry. Parents, know that I do not take it lightly for the times you entrust your children to me as they grow in their faith. To the teens, there is no youth ministry without the youth. I ask you to come see what youth ministry is all about, bring your friends and help me build up a solid community of young people in our parish. I am here to walk with you as you come to know Christ and assist you as you come to understand what that means for your life as a young person today. And lastly, I ask you all for your prayers for the young people of our parish and the high school youth ministry program. I am thrilled to begin this adventure as I get to know the people of Christ the Divine Shepherd Parish. Feel free to stop me and introduce yourself when you see me around. NEXT GENERATION PARISH

As we work toward the priorities identified in the Next Generation Parish, we will occasionally include brief reflections explaining why we do what we do at Mass. These are intended to help you, our parishioners, enter more deeply into the Liturgy.

LITURGICAL SEASONS AND COLORS

The Church year is divided into several distinct liturgical seasons, each of which determines the colors of the vestments worn during Mass.

GREEN:	RED:	WHITE:	VIOLET:
			
Used during Ordinary Time it means hope	Used on Feasts associated with the Lord's passion, the Holy Spirit and Feasts of martyrs. It represents blood, fire, God's love, martyrdom, and Jesus' Passion.	Used during the seasons of Christmas and Easter, and Feasts of the Lord (besides those of His passion), and for Feasts of Mary, angels, saints who were not martyrs and nuptial masses, it represents innocence, light, triumph and	Used in the seasons of Advent and Lent as well as for funerals. The Liturgical Year begins with the First Sunday of Advent. The color worn is violet, signifying a time of preparation. On the Third Sunday of Advent, called Gaudete Sunday, vestments may be rose as a sign of joyful anticipation.

The Christmas Season begins with the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve. The liturgical color is white or another festive color such as gold. The Christmas Season includes the celebration of the Epiphany and continues until the Baptism of the Lord, usually celebrated on the Sunday after Epiphany.

N E X T G E N E R A T I O N P A R I S H

Next, the Church enters Ordinary Time. The term “ordinary” does not mean “plain” but refers to the numbering of the Sundays with ordinal numbers (e.g., Second Sunday in Ordinary Time). The liturgical color is green, symbolizing growth and hope.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, and the color returns to violet, representing a time of repentance and spiritual renewal. On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, known as Laetare Sunday, rose vestments may again be worn as a sign of rejoicing.

Palm Sunday, also called Passion Sunday, marks the beginning of Holy Week, and the liturgical color is red, signifying Christ’s Passion.

The Sacred Triduum concludes the Lenten Season and consists of unique liturgies:

- *Holy Thursday (Mass of the Lord’s Supper): white or gold*
- *Good Friday (not a Mass, but a liturgy): red*
- *Holy Saturday (no liturgy until the evening)*

The Easter Season begins with the Great Vigil of Easter, the “Mother of All Liturgies.” This Mass is distinct in its structure and celebration. The color is white or gold. The Easter celebration continues for eight days, known as the Octave of Easter, during which each day is celebrated as Easter Day. The color remains white. The Easter Season lasts 50 days, culminating with Pentecost, where the color is red, symbolizing the fire of the Holy Spirit. After Pentecost, the Church returns to Ordinary Time, and green is worn again.

On days when special celebrations are permitted, such as memorials, feasts, and solemnities, other colors are used:

- *Red for martyrs and the Holy Spirit*
- *White for non-martyr saints, angels, and feasts of the Lord (except for His Passion)*
- *Gold or silver may be used on particularly solemn occasions*

The final Sunday of the Liturgical Year is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (Christ the King). It replaces the Thirty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, and the color is white or gold.

Mission Appeal



We welcome back Father Faustine Furaha from the Diocese of Moshi in Tanzania. Fr. Faustine returns to share an important mission close to his heart: the construction of St. William Girls' Secondary School. This Catholic school will provide essential educational opportunities to young girls who, due to cultural and economic barriers, are often denied the chance to learn and thrive. Thanks to initial support, classrooms are nearly complete, but the school still needs additional funding to open:

- \$16,000 is needed to finish the classrooms, including final construction work and furnishings.
- \$25,000 is needed for the convent, which will provide housing for the religious sisters who will teach and care for the students. These funds will cover roofing, interior finishing, and furniture.

In many parts of Tanzania, girls are still overlooked when it comes to education—not because they lack talent or potential, but simply because they are girls. Offering education to these young women is a powerful way to share the Gospel and transform lives. Please consider supporting this mission and helping open the doors to a brighter future for the girls of Tanzania.


