Prayer Before Mass

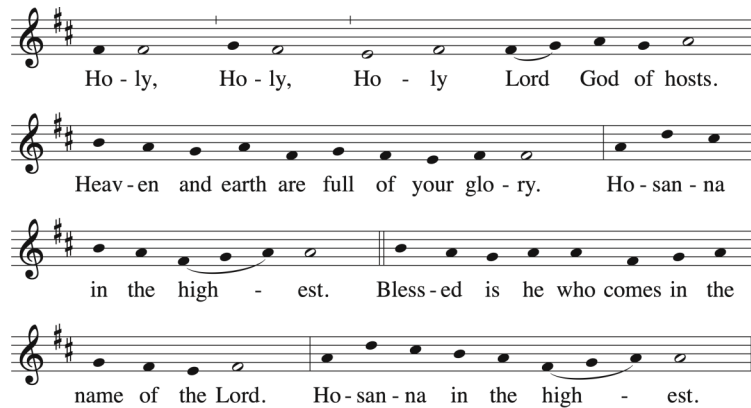

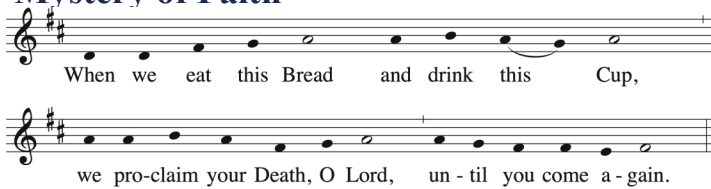

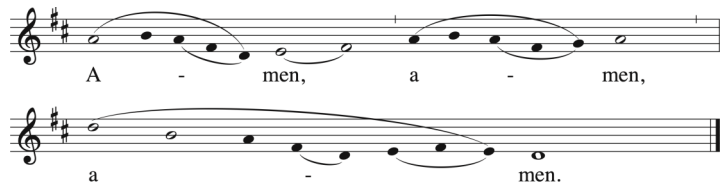

I want to draw your attention to the Altar Server practices we have this Wednesday and Thursday evening at Saint Bernadette Church (August 27 and 28). Practice will start at 6:30 p.m. and conclude at 8:00 p.m.

(Altar servers will be trained in a way that will work for both of our churches.) Any 3rd through 12th grade student who is currently serving, or who is interested in serving, should come to at least one of the practices. There are two others scheduled for late September (the 22nd and 29th). I hope this will enable us to have a solid rotation of servers for most, if not all, of our Saturday evening and Sunday Masses.

Deacon Nick Wytiaz's departure caught perhaps not a few people off guard. "Where is he going?" The answer: back to Saint Mary Seminary for his final year of seminary in preparation for ordination to the Holy Priesthood next June. He will be back for Christmas and Easter, but otherwise he is there. We already miss him!

Among the many things Deacon Nick was able to do during his summer with us was form a group of Eucharistic Missionaries. I had the privilege of joining them this past Tuesday for a prayerful commissioning. I expect much fruit to come from this initiative. Thanks to our Eucharistic Missionaries, and to Deacon Nick and his team.

A few people have asked why we took out the lovely tree near our office entrances at Saint Bernadette. It was not us, but an "Act of God," as that tree was felled by the April 30 mega-storm that knocked out power for a few days and caused much additional havoc. With the tree gone, the quiet oasis it permitted no longer existed, and I thought it best just to plant (or attempt to plant) grass there for now.

You will see elsewhere in the bulletin that we are having "Donut Sunday" after the 9:00 a.m. Mass at Saint Susanna in September. We are planning to have this event at Saint Bernadette as well, and will provide further details when this is finalized.

Patriotic Rosary

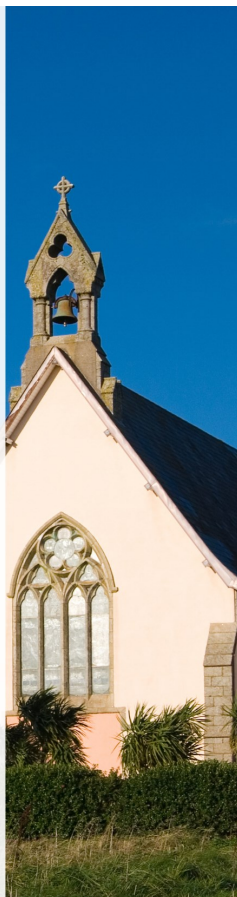

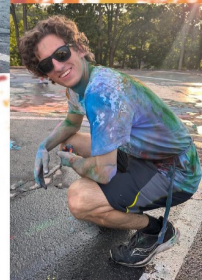
ALTAR SERVER TRAINING
