What are you giving up for Lent?

Growing up Catholic, the perennial question at this time of year was “What are YOU giving up for Lent?” I’m sure it was a way to ensure my “holiness” was up to par with others’. (Not exactly a good motive.) I used to wait until Ash Wednesday to even start thinking of what I was going to “give up” for the dreaded 40 days. If I procrastinated enough, I didn’t actually have to start until Lent was about half over. As I grew older (and hopefully a little wiser) I started thinking about it a little before Lent so I was prepared to start on Ash Wednesday.

Also, in the past, I would give up things like snacks (which is still a good thing to do) but I also began to include giving up things like complaining or other bad habits that I would rather not do. I also learned that I could also try to do more good acts like being extra helpful to other people or doing spiritual reading or praying more.

In this Information Age, there is no shortage of ideas for Lent. For a “low tech” option, we have our “Lenten Purple Sheet” that was in the bulletin last week. If you’re more tech savvy, we have events and offerings on our parish website, our parish facebook page and our parish app. You could be overwhelmed by the volume, pick just one thing to do and start there. If you find that is too easy, you can always add another.

Lent is a sort of a yearly spiritual “spring cleaning.” It is a reminder to take time to see how our lives are going and ask questions like, “How is my spiritual life?” or “Am I practicing my faith?” or a good question might be, “If I were on trial for being a Catholic, would there be enough evidence to convict me?” Happy Lent!

Here at Holy Family, we will also offer time for quiet reflection with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament or a presentation in our series of Adult Faith Formation at the same time as confessions are available. Why do Catholics practice fasting and abstinence during Lent?

Lent is the 40 days before Easter in which Catholics pray, fast, contemplate, and engage in acts of spiritual self-discipline. Catholics do these things because Easter, which celebrates the Resurrection of Christ, is the greatest holy day of the Christian year (even above Christmas) and Catholics have recognized that it is appropriate to prepare for such a holy day by engaging in such disciplines.



The reason Lent lasts 40 days is that 40 is the traditional number seen in judgment and spiritual testing in the Bible (Gn 7:4, Ex 24:18, 34:28, Nm 13:25, 14:33, Jon 3:4). Lent bears particular relationship to the 40 days Christ spent fasting in the desert before entering into his public ministry (Mt 4:1-11). Catholics imitate Christ by spending 40 days in spiritual discipline before the celebration of Christ's triumph over sin and death.

Fasting is biblical discipline that can be defended from both the Old and the New Testament. Christ expected his disciples to fast (Mt 9:14-15) and issued instructions for how they should do so (Mt 6:16-18). Catholics follow this pattern by holding a partial fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.



Abstinence from certain foods is also a biblical discipline. In Daniel 10:2-3 we read, "In those days I, Daniel, was mourning for three weeks. I ate no delicacies, no meat or wine entered my mouth, nor did I anoint myself at all, for the full three weeks." Catholics use a practice similar to Daniel's when, as a way of commemorating Christ's Crucifixion on a Friday, they abstain from eating meat on that day of the week during Lent. The only kind of flesh they eat on Friday is fish, which is symbol of Christ.



Even the Ash Wednesday practice of having one's forehead signed with ashes has a biblical parallel. Putting ashes on one's head was a common biblical expression of mourning (1 Sm 13:19, Est 4:1, Is 61:3, Jer 6:26, Ez 27:30, Dn 9:3, Mt 11:21, Lk 10:13). By having the sign of the cross made with ashes on their foreheads, Catholics mourn Christ's suffering on the cross and their own sins, which made that suffering necessary.

The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Liturgy Link

Bowing

People express reverence and respect in different ways. Many cultures bow as a sign of respect to another. In our Catholic tradition we do this in many areas and in two different forms. One form is a “profound bow”, it is accomplished by bending at the waist and leaning forward. The other form is a “simple bow”, which is done by leaning one’s head forward, chin to chest. Sometimes people default to one form, which is ok. Let’s consider when and why we bow.

At Holy Family Parish the tabernacle is not in our sanctuary. As we arrive and enter our pew we make a profound bow to the altar. We also make a profound bow during the Creed, when the Blessed Sacrament is reposed and when we leave our pew at the end of Mass.

We make a simple bow when the Book of the Gospel is lifted and shown to us, when we approach the Body and Blood at Communion and when Father says “bow your heads” for the blessing at the end of Mass.

Bowing is always an act of reverence. When the Book of the Gospels is shown to us, we are not bowing to a book but to the living Word of God (Jesus present in the Word). When we bow to the altar as we enter and leave the church we are reverencing the sacrifice of the Eucharist in which we partake. When bowing in the Creed we reverence the great mystery of Christ’s life, death and resurrection. Our bow to the Body and Blood of Jesus is our assent to the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist which we reaffirm in our Amen!

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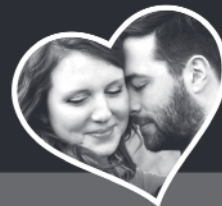


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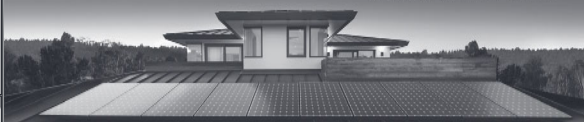


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
