Anointing of the Sick

On Saturday October 21st at the 5:30pm Mass we will offer anointing of the sick. The church teaches, that this is a Sacrament of healing, and that if the time of death has already approached, we have waited too long to receive the sacrament. There are many different reasons one would want to receive this sacrament, including: going in for surgery, becoming seriously ill, having prolonged mental illness, and effects of aging. The basic requirement of someone seeking this sacrament is that they need healing, and wish to be strengthened through God's graces poured out in the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. It is recommended that the individuals seek the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation prior to receiving the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. We invite all who need the healing of this sacrament to join us at this Mass.

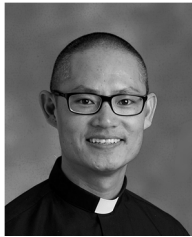

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Jesus reminds us, "I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you received me in your homes, naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me." The righteous will then answer him, 'When, Lord, did we ever see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you a drink? When did we ever see you a stranger and welcome you in our homes, or naked and clothe you? When did we ever see you sick or in prison, and visit you?' The King will reply, 'I tell you, whenever you did this for one of the least important of these followers of mine, you did it for me!' (Mathew 25:35-40)

Small Things Count

A kid you know is complaining about mean messages about him on Twitter, an embarrassing picture of him on Facebook, a humiliating profile that popped up on another site, a rumor about him sent out on all his friends' emails or texts. All of these are examples of cyber bullying, and none are harmless fun that will just fade away. In fact, kids who are victims of cyber bullying tend to have life changes: they may cut classes, use drugs and alcohol, do poorly in school, become unhealthy (physically and/or emotionally), and be victims of in-person bullying. All adults in a youngster's life need to be vigilant to guard against this. We must keep aware of what our kids are doing online, and that includes the Internet, social sites, emails, and texting. We must talk with our kids about what goes on in cyber-space, set rules, and monitor adherence to those rules. All schools have such rules, and we must make sure that our kids and we are familiar with them. Yes, the kids will complain. But—and here's what's important—they'll be safe.

Continued from last week....

After the Lord's Prayer the presider says what we call an "embolism". It comes from the Greek word, *embolismos*, which means to throw in. The text of the Lord's Prayer can be found in scripture, these additional words are not stated. The embolism, the use of which dates to the first centuries, is an interpretation of the last petition. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) helps us understand the Lord's Prayer as 7 petitions. The last one, "but deliver us from evil", is what is being referred to as the last petition. Next time you're at Mass, listen to the words of the priest and hear it as a reinterpretation of the very last words you've said in the Our Father.

After the embolism, the gathered people conclude with another doxology. The doxology is a liturgical formula of praise to God. When you say these words, remind yourself to truly incorporate these words into your daily life. "For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever." Living the life of a disciple means all we do, all we have, and all we will ever be, is for the glory of God and His kingdom forever, and we remind ourselves of this with these words.

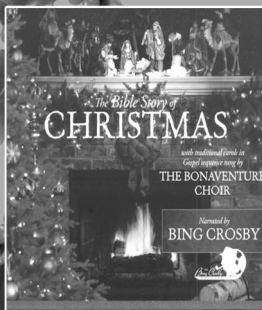

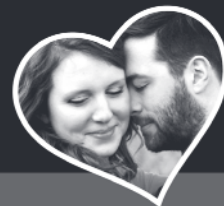
