

Jeanes Street is now closed to all walking and driving traffic.

Stanwood Entrance: Parents may walk their children to the line of cones. Only children will go past the cones. We are trying to make sure that only students enter the school.


Rhawn Street: There is a coned pathway for students to walk to the school buildings. Students and families will walk between the cones and the convent grass. This will eliminate students walking diagonally across the parking lot. Students should not come through the parking lot by the church; they should only walk in between the cones and the convent. (We will use this same route for dismissal for all exiting by Rhawn Street.)

Student Arrival Times and Locations:

- Before 7:30 All students go directly to the Cafeteria.
- At 7:30 Grades 6 to 8 go directly to their classrooms.
- From 7:30 7:45 Grades K to 5 go to the gym and enter through the gym door.
- From 7:45 8:00 Grades PK to 5 enter the main door with the doorbell.
- After 8:00 All Students must report to the main office.

Dismissal: Students who need to meet siblings will either wait inside the Stanwood Schoolyard or wait by the Blessed Mother grotto in front of the convent, if exiting on Rhawn Street. Students and families must cross by the crossing guard and inside the cross. There is to be **NO DOUBLE PARKING OR CROSSING IN THE MIDDLE OF** THE STREETS. Thank you for all your help as we try to foster safer routines and strategies!

School Hours: School begins at 8:00 a.m. with prayer. All students should be in their classrooms by that time. Thank you for your cooperation and assistance!
