

Liturgical Colors

Have you noticed the changing colors of our sanctuary decor and clergy vestments? These changes are not random. They are based on the Liturgical Season, including Feast Days. The color assignments symbolize the following:



- 1. White: purity, joy, glory, resurrection of Jesus Christ
 - Used during: Easter and Christmas seasons, feasts of Our Lady, and for saints who weren't martyrs, incl. All Saints Day & All Souls Day
- Green: spiritual life, growth, hopeUsed during: Ordinary Time
- 3. Red: the Blood of Christ and the fire of the Holy Spirit, sacrifice, charity, martyrdom
 - Used during: Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Pentecost, and feasts of martyrs
- 4. Violet/Purple: penance, sorrow, royalty
 - Used during: Advent (more bluish purple), Lent (more reddish purple), vigils, and penitential celebrations
- 5. Rose/Pink: joy, hopeful pause during Advent and Lent
 - Used during: The third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) and the fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday)

Time for our Annual Pew Count!



For two weekends in October, the Diocese of Sacramento requires each parish to count the number of adults and children in attendance at our weekend Masses. Here at SS. Peter and Paul,

we will complete this task during the weekends of October 4th/5th and October 11th/12th.

The purpose of this count is to provide an estimate of the number of practicing Catholics in the Diocese. The information gathered from this count assists the Office of the Bishop in tracking shifting parish populations, assessing various needs in the Diocese, and planning for the future. Therefore, you will see volunteers walking the aisles with "clicker counters" during the Offertory.

Priest Convocation will be held Tuesday, October 14th to Friday, October 17th, during which all priests within our Diocese will assemble for spiritual renewal, professional development, fraternity, and study time.



Please note: **Daily Mass will not be celebrated** during Priest Convocation. The Church and Chapel will be open for private prayer from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM.

Reminders of the hiatus will be shared at Daily Mass the week before, and a notice will be posted to the front door of the Church that week.



In today's Gospel we learn a little bit about faith. In fact, Jesus says we only need a tiny bit of faith to do amazing things. If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, He said, you can tell a tree to throw itself into the sea and it will!

But what is faith? Faith is believing. We have faith in our parents and teachers. That means that we believe what they tell us and we trust them. We have faith in our friends too. Faith in God is a little bit different, though. It is a gift He gives us so that we can believe in Him.

When we are baptized God gives us the gift of faith. Then it's up to us to use it. We use that gift when we decide to believe in God and what He tells us in the Church and the Bible.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading—Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

The book of the prophet Habakkuk is one of the smaller books of the Bible. A contemporary of Jeremiah, he preached at a time when Babylon threatened to destroy Jerusalem. Today's passage is a dialogue between the prophet and the Lord.

Second Reading—2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Although the author attributes second Timothy to St. Paul, it was probably written by someone else as much as 30 years after Paul's death. This was an acceptable practice at the time. One important theme of this letter is the need to be faithful to the Gospel and not to be swayed by false teachings.

Gospel Reading—Luke 17:5-10

The disciples in today's gospel want Jesus to fix things by giving them more faith. Jesus reassures them that they already have faith enough to transform what seems utterly immovable. A mulberry tree has a deep and extensive root system and is extremely difficult to uproot and replant. It is an apt image for deep-rooted systems of injustice and violence. A mustard seed, by contrast, is tiny, but spreads like wildfire, and is also nearly impossible to eradicate. Disciples who feel puny in the face of massive systems of injustice have all they need to do the transformative work toward fulfillment of Jesus' vision of the reign of God. Jesus encourages them by saying not only that they have all the faith they need but also that it is by their persistent, day-in, day-out service that the transformation of seemingly intractable systems comes about. Moreover, just as fieldwork and table service were simply what was required of a slave in Jesus' time, so faithful service on behalf of the gospel is what is expected of disciples.

Rock of our salvation, you are steadfast in your love for us, despite our lack of faith and our unbelief. May we hear and respond to your voice, that our hearts might be softened and our lives reflect the good



gifts you have given us. Trusting in your promise, we pray to you, O Lord. Amen.
