

Like the leper who returned to thank Jesus, take time each day this week to thank God for the blessings of your day. Consider using bedtime as a time to review your day and count your blessings.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading—2 Kings 5:14-17

Elisha, who lived about 800 years before Christ, was the successor of the great prophet Elijah. Naaman was a pagan army officer from Syria who came to Elisha, seeking a cure for his leprosy. We pick up the story at this point.

Second Reading—2 Timothy 2:8-13

We continue reading from second Timothy. This letter was written about 30 years after Paul's death to a typical Church leader as represented by Timothy. Today's passage begins with a slogan-like summary of Paul's teachings about Christ and concludes with what may be part of an ancient Christian hymn.

Gospel Reading—Luke 17:11-19

The first reading and the gospel today tell stories of two different men afflicted with leprosy. Both are foreigners who nonetheless are healed by Israel's prophets, Elisha and Jesus. Both praise the God of Israel for their transformation.

In the gospel, the focus is on the way the one healed man turns around and loudly glorifies God, falling at Jesus' feet, thanking him. Perhaps this man's turning around was not only physical but interior as well; when he lets gratitude consume him, he turns round from any other cancers that eat at his spirit. Jesus affirms that this kind of faith, rooted in thankfulness, is the healing, saving power that enables him to go forward as a changed person, both in body and spirit.

Naaman struggles mightily to turn away from his stance of entitlement, from his attempts to buy healing, and to direct the manner in which it should occur. After his healing, Naaman still tries to pay for it, but Elisha will take nothing from him. All that God or Jesus desires in return is a heart shaped by saving gratitude for freely given grace that has the power to heal both the inner and outer self.

Almighty God, you have shown your glory and power to all the ends of the earth through countless miracles, including the healing of lepers. May we sing of your goodness today and all days, telling the world of your wondrous deeds. Amen.
