

RITE OF ENTRANCE





Jubilee Year Pilgrims of Hope Join the Revival!

The Revival will take place on **Thursday and Friday, November 6 & 7, 2025** at **6:30 PM** at St. Anthony Catholic Church, 660 Florin Road, in the Pocket neighborhood of Sacramento, CA.

The Revival is sponsored by the Diocese of Sacramento Black Catholic Ministry. The Revivalist will be Reverend Anthony Bozeman, SSJ, a Roman Catholic priest of St. Joseph's Society of the Sacred Heart, also known as the Josephites (https://www.josephites.org/), of Washington, DC.

A Philadelphia, PA native, Fr. Bozeman was educated in Philadelphia Catholic schools and graduated from La Salle University. He served in the United States Air Force, serving a combined 16 years of active duty and Air National



Guard service before receiving a call to the priesthood. Fr. Bozeman was ordained into the priesthood on May 20, 2000 in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Fr. Bozeman served in pastoral ministry in Philadelphia, Houston, New Orleans, and Los Angeles, before being appointed the Academic Dean of St Joseph's Seminary in Washington, DC and the Assistant Director of Vocations for the Josephites. In July of this year, Fr. Bozeman was appointed the full-time Director of Vocations for the Josephites. He is a past president of the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus and beloved mentor to the National Black Catholic Seminarians Association. Fr. Bozeman is the current Chaplain for the Northern States District of the Knights of Peter Claver and Ladies Auxiliary, the largest and oldest predominantly Black Catholic fraternal organization in the country. Fr. Bozeman is known for his energetic, dynamic preaching style, and is nationally sought after for preaching, retreats, & revivals.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

All Souls' Day

Gospel Reading—John 6:37-40

Anyone who knows the loss of a loved one knows the seeming finality of death, of saying goodbye to someone they held dear. That pain is real, and nothing can reverse that loss. Yet the first reading from Wisdom says it is only to the "foolish" that the just seem to be dead. Is it foolish to cling to hope that God would indeed raise the just? If we can recognize the evil of death when we see it, shall we not also see goodness? Faith can be difficult when reality seems to show anything but God's love and presence. We cling to the cross of Christ at the darkest times, when all else seems lost, because nothing else will hold. *Ave Crux*, *spes unica*—hail the cross, our only hope!

Jesus promises in the gospel that all who come to him will be raised on the last day. On All Souls' Day, we remember this promise with our own loved ones in mind, asking that God will show them mercy as we know God desires. Prayer for the dead is a spiritual work of mercy because we offer our own love for those in need.

Lord Jesus Christ, you have said that all who believe in you will never die, but will have eternal life. We trust in this promise and believe that we shall someday see you face-to-face. May those who have gone before us rest in your loving embrace.
