

Dedication of the Lateran Basilica


What is a sacred building: A divine dwelling? A gathering place for God's people? A metaphor for a body?

On this Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, we celebrate the unity of the Church under the leadership of our pope. Did you know that the Basilica of Saint John Lateran is the seat of the

pope (not Saint Peter's)? The land on which the current basilica was built (commissioned in 1646 A.D.) was originally dedicated on November 9, 324 A.D. by Pope St. Sylvester I. An inscription at the site reads "Mother of all churches of Rome and the world". Beneath its high altar rests the remains of the small wooden table on which, according to tradition, St. Peter celebrated Mass. This feast day gives us the opportunity to reflect on the role that our pope, the bishop of Rome, has in bearing witness to Christ and to preserving the unity of the Christian faithful.

November Remembrance / All Soul's

In the month of November, we remember in a special way those who have gone before us in faith. Beginning on November 1st up until Thanksgiving Day, the parish book of remembrance will be located in the vestibule.



You are invited to enter the names of your loved ones who have died this past year or the names of the dead which you have not entered into the book in previous years.

In addition, remember to pick up your All Soul's Day envelopes which will be available at the church door entrances and print the names of your deceased relatives and friends to be remembered for the All-Soul's Day Masses throughout the month of November. You may return the envelope in the offertory basket when the collection is taken up at Mass.



LITURGY LINK

The word "corporal" comes from the Latin word for body. The small square linen cloth that is placed on the altar during the Liturgy of the Eucharist is called a corporal.



The corporal's purpose is to collect any fragments from the Eucharistic body of Christ during the Mass. At Mass today, note when the corporal is placed on the altar and when it is removed.




