The Lavabo




The "lavabo" has two definitions. First, it is the ritual our priests perform when washing their hands during the preparation of gifts. Second, it is the bowl which is used to perform this ritual. During the lavabo, the

priest quietly says, "Lord, wash away my iniquities and cleanse me of my sins." This is a rite of interior purification. It is a prayer said by the priest, for the priest, as an expression of a desire to be purified before handling the Precious Body and Chalice.

In the month of November, we remember in a special way those who have gone before us in faith. Beginning on November 1st up until Thanksgiving Day, the parish book of remembrance will be located in the vestibule.





BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading—Malachi 3:19-20

The book of Malachi was written after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon. Faced with problems on all sides, many in the community doubted whether God would ever again act on their behalf. In today's passage, Malachi responds to these skeptics.

Second Reading—2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Second Thessalonians addresses concerns early Christians had about the coming of Christ in glory. Some were excessively interested in the day and hour of Christ's coming. Others thought that his imminent coming was an invitation to idleness.

Gospel Reading—Luke 21:5-19

In today's gospel reading, Jesus interrupts the awe-struck comments of onlookers at the monumental temple in Jerusalem to declare that not one stone of the building would be left upon another. For any Jew, the destruction of the temple, which symbolized their connection to God, by Roman imperial forces would provoke a severe crisis.

Jesus then describes cataclysmic happenings that will wreak destruction and death. He directs his listeners how to respond to these crises. If they are following him, then they too will say and do things that threaten some of the political and religious structures of their day.

First of all, he reminds his followers not to follow after anyone else; their attention must remain steadfastly on him. He speaks the same words that Gabriel spoke to Zechariah and Mary when their worlds were being turned upside down: "Do not be afraid" (Luke 1:13, 30). When disciples are seized and persecuted and handed over to the authorities because of Jesus' name, there are times to testify to the power of God. The preparation consists in preserving in a life of faithfulness and trust in the One who provoked crises by his manner of life.

Lord Jesus, you have warned us about the trials that are to come in the latter days, yet sometimes it feels as if those days are already upon us. Give us the strength to trust in your word, to proclaim your name, and to persevere in spreading your love and your truth. Amen.


