# Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

This year marks the 100th Celebration of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ,

King of the Universe. This feast (Christ the King) was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism. Originally celebrated in October, the feast shifted to the very last Sunday of Ordinary Time following Vatican II. Theological emphasis also shifted to one that culminates the entire liturgical year, explicitly pointing towards the Christ's Second Coming and the ultimate establishment of His eternal kingdom at the end of time.

Jesus Christ's eternal authority over the world is one that is not temporal and fleeting. God does not seek to be king to get something from us. He is king for <u>our</u> good. And His Kingship begins within the heart.

Though the days increase in their darkness, the Lord of light and love reigns supreme. May the power of God's love be King in your hearts and reflected in your lives now and always.

Next Sunday we enter the first Sunday of a new liturgical year (Cycle A), where we will embark on our journey through the Gospel of Matthew – Advent begins!

#### November Remembrance / All Soul's

In the month of November, we remember in a special way those who have gone before us in faith. Beginning on November 1st up until Thanksgiving Day, the parish book of remembrance will be located in the vestibule.



You are invited to enter the names of your loved ones who have died this past year or the names of the dead which you have not entered into the book in previous years.

In addition, remember to pick up your All Soul's Day envelopes which will be available at the church door entrances and print the names of your deceased relatives and friends to be remembered for the All-Soul's Day Masses throughout the month of November. You may return the envelope in the offertory basket when the collection is taken up at Mass.

#### **FAMILY CONNECTION**

Understanding today's Feast of Christ the King may be particularly challenging. While we may not have a direct experience of kings or royalty, we have some sense of what these mean. We know that royalty have sovereignty over their kingdom. We know that those who are subjects to royalty offer them allegiance and honor. Christ is King in a way that is different from traditional understandings of royalty. Christ's kingship extends to all places, all people, and all times. Christ manifests his kingship through his death on the Cross, in which he offers salvation to all.

Tell your children that this Sunday is the last Sunday in the Church Year, and on this Sunday, we celebrate a special feast called the Feast of Christ the King. Read today's Gospel, Luke 23:35-43. Reflect together on how the various people in this Gospel respond to Jesus on the Cross. Who in this Gospel recognizes Jesus as King? (the thief) What does Jesus promise the thief as a result? (The thief will be with Jesus in paradise.)

Talk about how your family will recognize and honor Christ the King. Pray together the Lord's Prayer and ask God to help your family to act in ways that show you recognize and honor Christ as King.





# BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

## First Reading—2 Samuel 5:1-3

The two books of Samuel describe a time early in Jewish history when the 12 tribes were forming one nation under a single king. After the death of Saul, their first king, the tribes decided upon a successor, as we will hear in this reading.

## Second Reading—Colossians 1:12-20

In our age of space travel, there is sometimes speculation about Christ's place in the wider universe, particularly if life were found on other planets. Today's passage quotes an early Christian hymn which describes the kingship of Christ in cosmic terms.

## Gospel Reading—Luke 23:35-43

Some people in Jesus' day were looking for a king like David, who would overpower imperial Roman rule and reestablish Israel's independence. And there were real advantages to monarchical rule. When Jesus appeared, proclaiming God's kingdom, he offered an antidote to imperial ways. He criticized the way the "kings of the Gentiles" lorded their power over their people and demanded recognition for their benefactors.

By contrast, he urged the leaders among his followers to be the servants of all (Luke 22:26-27), a manner of life he modeled for them as he took up his itinerant mission with people at the lowest rungs of society. Unlike a monarch who imposes harsh punishments for infractions, he instead exercised power through forgiveness and compassion when there were transgressions.

Today's gospel paints in stark contrast the power of imperial Rome, which brooks no challenges to its rule, and the "kingly" ways of Jesus that rest on forgiveness and love. Even as it appears that the former may win out, the gospel makes it utterly clear that Jesus' merciful rule cannot be extinguished by death.

Lord Jesus Christ, we revere you as our King, although you did not acknowledge that title. Still we go forth rejoicing, proclaiming your name throughout the earth. In you and through you we were created, and by your love we hope to someday dwell with you in your heavenly kingdom. Amen.


