The Christmas Season

The liturgical season of Christmas follows Advent. It begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve

and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him, including the fact that he was born to die for us.

The Christmas tree and the Nativity scene are popular symbols of the season and a tradition in many Christian homes. Having received the gift of Christ, we naturally want to pass that gift along to our loved ones.

You likely know it by the song title, but the 12 Days of Christmas, or Christmastide, is the period that is the time between the two major Christmas feasts: the Nativity of the Lord on December 25 and Epiphany. Christmas was the major "birth" feast in the ancient Western churches and Epiphany was the major feast in the Eastern churches. The days between them have important significance.

Other Christmas feasts include the Holy Family (Sunday following Christmas), and Mary, Mother of God (January 1). The liturgical season of Christmas ends with the feast of the Lord's Baptism, traditionally, the Sunday after Epiphany.

FAMILY CONNECTION

In the midst of the Christmas season, it is quite appropriate that our liturgy asks us to pause to consider the Holy Family. In today's Gospel, we hear about how Joseph protected Jesus from danger by relocating the family to Egypt in obedience to God. Following the model of the Holy Family, we might use this feast to recall the responsibility that each family member has to contribute to the good of the family and recommit ourselves to one another. Remind one another that each member of the family contributes to the good of the whole family. Recall that Jesus was also part of a family and that this Sunday we celebrate the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Pray together that your family will continue to protect and care for one another as Mary and Joseph protected and cared for Jesus.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

First Reading—Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

The book of Sirach was written by a wise teacher who lived 200 years before Christ. Sirach ran a school for young people in Jerusalem. In today's section, he advises his students on the proper way to honor their parents.

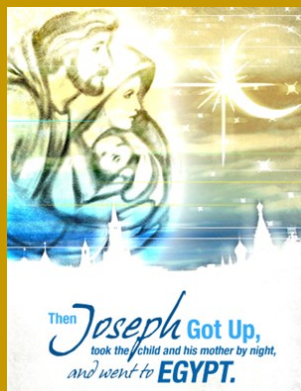
Second Reading—Colossians 3:12-17

The letter to the Colossians was written around the year 80 A.D. A significant concern in this letter is how the Christian community appears to outsiders. The author offers guidelines so that Christian families will live in such a way that others will notice the difference.

Gospel Reading—Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

Today's gospel tells of Joseph's dream, in which a divine messenger relays Herod's intent to kill the infant Jesus. The angel instructs Joseph to flee with Mary and the child to Egypt, a traditional place of refuge for Israelites. Like many migrants today, they faced a treacherous desert crossing, though the gospel tells none of those details. We can only imagine Mary and Joseph's fear as they stole away under the cover of darkness and all the hardships they endured. Matthew says nothing about what happened when they arrived in a strange place, having to navigate in an unfamiliar language and culture. Who helped them along the way? How did Joseph find work? What did Mary think about Joseph's dreams?

The experience of the Holy Family of having to flee for their lives into a foreign land gives strength and courage to millions of today's migrants. Those living in their countries of destination are challenged by the gospel to consider what kind of welcome they would offer to newcomers if they were none other than Jesus' own family.



God of love, on this feast of the Holy Family, we call to mind joys and the struggles of family life. By the witness of our lives and the practices of our faith communities, may the church be a place of welcome, healing, support, and protection for all families. Amen.
