


The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Though we might expect Luke's account of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, we have instead, the multiplication of the loaves. This episode is laden

with Eucharistic overtones, especially in the verbs used: taking, blessed, broke, and shared. These ARE the verbs used at the Last Supper and the verbs we use TODAY in our Eucharistic liturgy. We feast on the body of Jesus, food for the world! We become what we receive.







### BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

#### The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

First Reading—Genesis 14:18-20

Today's reading from the book of Genesis tells us all we know about an obscure king named Melchizedek. Abraham had just won a military victory, and Melchizedek honors him with a meal of bread and wine. Over the course of time, this meal was seen as a distant foreshadowing of the Eucharist, which is why this passage was chosen for today's feast.

#### Second Reading—1 Corinthians 11:23-26

The first letter to the Corinthians was written about 25 years after Christ's death and resurrection. Today's passage contains our earliest written account of what Jesus did at the Last Supper. It predates even the Gospels.

#### Gospel Reading—Luke 9:11b-17

Today's feast day celebrates the gift of Christ, who entrusted his entire self to us, in his life and ministry but especially in his self-surrender in death.

In the gospel, we see how easy it is to miss the moment when such self-gift is asked of us. The crowds have been with Jesus all day. Now they are tired and hungry, and the Twelve suggest to Jesus that he send the crowd into the surrounding villages to get food.

Instead, Jesus directs the Twelve to their own resources. He takes the five loaves and two fish, looks up to heaven, blesses, breaks, and gives them to the disciples to set before the crowd. There is plenty for all and then some. The miracle is a summons to the giving of our whole selves to the One who is the Source of all nourishment so that we may be broken open in love for the life of the world.

Such self– giving is not possible on our own. It is in the gathered assembly of believers, where we remember Christ's act in sacramental ritual, that we gain strength and give courage to one another to entrust ourselves to this kind of love.

God of abundance, through your miraculous power, you fed the five thousand with just a few loaves and fishes. Through the mystery of the Eucharist, we are fed with the very body and blood of Christ.

M ay these gifts sustain us in our pilgrim age here on earth and lead us to everlasting life. Am en.

Celebrating Children At SS. Peter & Paul Church




To the parents of our young children, may we suggest...

The way we welcome children in church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God, and to Jesus. Let them know that they are at home in this liturgical gathering (Mass).








When Jesus fed the crowd of five thousand with five loaves and two fish, He was giving an example of how He could feed everyone with His Body and Blood in Holy Communion.



# The **Body Blood** f Christ

When Jesus went back to Heaven He didn't want to leave us all alone, so He gave Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist. First He gave Himself to the Apostles at the Last Supper, and today He gives Himself to us in Holy Communion.

Normally when we eat something it gets absorbed into our body. But receiving Jesus in Holy Communion does something different. It makes us more into Jesus' Body! It brings our soul closer to God and closer to all the other people in the Church. That's what "Communion" means.

When we go to Communion in a state of grace we can get so much more grace from God. Our venial (small) sins can be taken away and we can get more strength to do His will. In fact, the time that your prayers are the most powerful is right after you receive Holy Communion, when Jesus is right inside you. He is your closest friend and only wants what is good for you. When you go to Communion remember Who you just received and don't forget to thank Him for coming to you!
