The Pastor, Deacon and Coordinator of Liturgy are standing members of the Committee. If you have an interest and love of our liturgy, you are welcome to serve on this committee which meets quarterly.

# Altar Servers www.rocklincatholic.org/altar-servers

Altar servers are responsible for assisting the priest at Mass. Children in 4th grade and above are encouraged to serve in this ministry. All training is provided.

# <u>Church Cleaning</u> www.rocklincatholic.org/church-cleaning

Made up of parishioners who perform light housekeeping duties on a weekly basis, typically on a Saturday morning, this ministry helps keep our church sparkling. This behind the scenes ministry is a way to get involved and have your accomplishments appreciated by all.

#### <u>Church Environment</u> www.rocklincatholic.org/church-environment

Our worship spaces are beautiful environments for prayer, reflection and celebration of the Eucharist. The individuals involved in this ministry add sensory elements to the environment during the entire year. The committee's goal is not just to create an attractive space, but to help the parish reflect on each occasion and inspire deeper prayer. Dedicated parishioners, men and women, are needed on this committee. Hours vary throughout the year.

### <u>Cleaning of Altar Linens</u> www.rocklincatholic.org/cleaning-of-linens

This ministry involves washing and ironing the purificators that are used for wiping the sacred cup during communion, and the towels that are used on the altar by Father and the Eucharistic Ministers. This home-based ministry rotates approximately once every three months.

#### **Eucharistic Ministry** www.rocklincatholic.org/eucharistic-ministers

As a Eucharistic Minister, you have responded to your baptism and the call to live as an active disciple of Jesus. And thus your role is a privilege, a humble and generous service, and a responsibility. You have the privilege of being Christbearers for God's people. And, your role (as for all of us) does not end when liturgy ends. We, the body of Christ, are called to bring the body of Christ to our world; to everyone we meet, in everything we do. These ministers participate in an initial training, ongoing trainings and days of prayer (retreat). They are placed on a rotation schedule and utilizing an online tool, you can indicate your availability.

#### <u>Lectors</u> www.rocklincatholic.org/lectors

Proclaiming the word of God at Mass is a dual ministry of praising God and of leading others to understand Scripture. Lectors require preparation for our voices to project clarity and understanding. This discipline of preparation ends up being a gift. The new insights we gain increase our love of Scripture. We receive more than we give. In becoming a lector, you agree to initial training and ongoing evaluations, trainings and days of prayer (retreat). They are placed on a rotation schedule and utilizing an online tool, you are able to indicate availability.

#### <u>Music Ministry</u> www.rocklincatholic.org/music

Music ministers pray using the language of music. By sharing their talents with the community, our music ministers greatly enrich our liturgies. Various styles of music are sung at each of the Masses and you are encouraged to find your place! Weekly rehearsals are provided and there are special choirs that are composed for special liturgical seasons. Share your gift!

#### Ushers (Ministers of Hospitality) www.rocklincatholic.org/ushers

Those who minister as ushers will be welcoming people to worship, tending their needs, helping them find a place, gathering their gifts during the collection and bidding them farewell when the Mass concludes. By nature, you are a person who wants to help. You have a deep faith in Christ, a love for the Mass, and a place in a community. Your desire to serve will help the faithful worship when they arrive at church. This ministry is open to men and women and training is provided.

At all Masses the welcoming committee is present to greet new people and invite them to register for the parish and to assist them in becoming a part of our faith community. This committee also mails cards to new families, congratulating them on life events or consoling them in times of grief. This committee is dedicated to reaching out and welcoming others.

#### SACRAMENTS, SPECIAL LITURGIES, and PREPARATION

## Anointing of the Sick

This sacrament is a celebration in which those who are seriously ill or infirm are surrounded and supported by others in the Christian community, either during a special Mass or a private ritual in their home or care facility. If you know someone who is in need of anointing, please call the parish office.

# Baptism of Infants and Young Children

This sacrament is celebrated for infants and children up to the age of six. It is celebrated communally twice a month, typically on the second and fourth Sundays of the months (except during Lent). Parents and at least one godparent must attend a preparation session prior to the child's baptism. Our classes are held online on the second Tuesdays of each month at 6:30 PM. Visit www.rocklincatholic.org/baptism for more information or to register for the class.

#### Baptism of Adults and Older Children www.rocklincatholic.org/rcia

The Order of Christian Initiation (OCIA) is the process by which adults and older children (over age 6) prepare for receiving Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist (full initiation). If baptism has already been celebrated, then this process provides an opportunity to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church, receiving Confirmation and First Eucharist. This process is in need of facilitators, sponsors, ministers of hospitality, and prayer partners. We need you!

#### **Confirmation** www.rocklincatholic.org/edge

Confirmation is celebrated in the eighth grade as part of the culmination to our middle school two-year program. We also provide preparation classes for older teens and adults.

#### **Eucharist** www.rocklincatholic.org/faith-formation

Eucharist is celebrated in the second grade after completion of a two year preparation process. Children are enrolled for two years in our family faith formation programs before receiving this sacrament.

#### *Funerals* www.rocklincatholic.org/funerals

The Catholic Mass of Christian Burial or a Memorial Service celebrates the mystery of life, death, and resurrection of Christ in a loved one who has died. We are happy to assist you in planning the funeral liturgy as well as helping you in your time of grief.

#### <u>Marriage</u> www.rocklincatholic.org/marriage

Couples desiring to be married in the Catholic church are welcomed! A date for the wedding should be arranged with the parish office at least six months prior to the desired wedding, this will allow time for preparation.

# <u>Marriage Preparation</u> www.rocklincatholic.org/marriage-preparation

All couples desiring marriage are required to participate in marriage preparation which includes attending an Engaged Encounter Weekend and an online tool called FOCCUS. Contact the office to meet with a priest or one of our deacons to discuss our marriage preparation process.

#### Quinceanera

If you would like to celebrate a Quinceanera at our parish, contact the parish office. There are particular guidelines in regard to the ritual and we are happy to help you celebrate this special milestone with reverence.

# Generations of Faith

Formation for All www.rocklincatholic.org/faith-formation

At SS. Peter & Paul, Generations of Faith embraces a vision of lifelong faith formation for our entire parish community. Whether you are a parent with young kids or teens, have children ready to receive a sacrament or not, are retired, a young adult, single or an empty nester, we welcome everyone to learn, grow, and live in faith together.

Generations of Faith includes ALL formational activities at the parish for people of all ages. Specifically, we address the needs of Youth and Family Formation, Youth Ministry, and Adult Faith Formation. We also provide activities (service, social, and liturgical) for entire households.

# Youth and Family Faith Formation (Grades Pre-K-8)

www.rocklincatholic.org/youthfamilyfaith

Nurturing a family of faith is not a spectator sport. We recognize the calling of parents as primary educators and role models to their children. We partner with and support parents to help them engage their families to learn and share their faith.

#### What does Youth & Family Faith involve?

- **Preschool 8th grades**: Faith Formation classes meet in-person on a scheduled basis September through April.
- **Parent Sessions:** Throughout the year, parents are expected to support their child's faith development by attending scheduled adult formation sessions and parent/child sessions.
- **Faith@Home**: Families are provided with at home lessons and activities to continue growing in faith together.
- Youth Ministry: Youth in 3rd 8th grades have the opportunity to gather with their peers for fun, social, and spiritual activities. More information can be found on the next page.
- **Sacrament Preparation**: All families seeking sacrament preparation for their children must be enrolled in Youth & Family Faith in addition to participating in immediate sacrament preparation parent/youth sessions.

#### Youth Ministry—www.rocklincatholic.org/youth-ministry

Youth Ministry provides an opportunity for our young people to build a community of their peers at SS. Peter & Paul and participate in fun, social, spiritual and service activities.

- Launch YM (3rd 5th grades)
- Lift YM (6th 8th grades)
- Life Teen (9th– 12 grades)

Launch and Lift Youth Ministry meet monthly for activities to enhance and enrich our Youth and Family Faith program. Involvement in Launch and Lift is optional and does not take the place of Youth & Family Faith (Pre-school-8th). Youth must be enrolled in Youth & Family Faith to participate and there is no additional fee.

Our Life Teen program aims to keep teens connected to our faith community. Life Teen meets Sunday evenings after the 5 PM Mass and offers a variety of activities based on teen interest. These activities include small faith groups, large group nights, service opportunities, social outings, mission trips, summer programs and more.

# Young Adult Ministrywww.rocklincatholic.org/young-adult-ministry

Our ministry with young adults has four goals:

- 1. To *connect young adults with Jesus Christ* through spiritual formation/direction, religious education/formation, and vocational discernment.
- 2. To *connect young adults to the Church* through evangelizing outreach, formation of the faith community, and pastoral care.
- 3. To *connect young adults with the mission of the Church in the world* through forming a Christian conscience, educating and developing leaders for the present and future.
- 4. To *connect young adults with a peer community* through developing peer leadership and identifying a young adult team for the purpose of forming faith communities of peers.

#### *Men's Bible Study* www.rocklincatholic.org/mens-bible-study

This method provides an in-depth, no nonsense look at various books in the Bible. This study runs all year long in Room #4. If one is unable to attend or misses a session, he can download and listen to the teaching on the website www.audiobiblestudy.org. This is facilitated by one leader and is a lecture format.

This group meets on Thursday nights and uses a variety of approaches in their studies. They typically use Ascension Press video-assisted programs. Open to both men and women and this group meets at 6:30 PM on Thursday nights, September through May.
