
# Immediate Opening for Coordinator of Liturgy





## BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

# The Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary T im e First Reading—Genesis 18:1-10

Chapters 12 to 25 of Genesis contain narratives about Abraham and Sarah, our father and mother in faith. Today the couple is visited by mysterious messengers from God. With customary Middle-Eastern hospitality, Abraham and Sarah welcome and lavishly feed the visitors who, in turn, promise something wonderful.

## Second Reading—Colossians 1:24-28

The letter to the Colossians was written around 80 A.D. to Christians who lived at Colossae, a city in what is today Turkey. A major emphasis of this letter is that Christ is the source of every grace and blessing that comes to human beings.

## Gospel Reading—Luke 10:38-42

Some scholars think today's gospel passage is not about the tension between active and contemplative living, but about conflicts surrounding women's exercise of their ministries in the early church. Some people favored women evangelizers and teachers like Prisca (Acts 18:26), Euodia and Syntyche (Phil 4:2); women prophets like Philip's four daughters (Acts 21:9); and women heads of house churches, like Nympha (Col 4:15), Mary (Acts 12:12), Lydia (Acts 16:40), and Prisca (Rom 16:3; 1 Cor. 16:19). Others, however, argued that a woman's place was in the home and that speaking and ministering in the public sphere belonged to the men (e.g., 1 Cor 14:34-35; 1 Tim 2:11-12). Luke takes the latter position, giving it validity by placing approval of the silent Mary on Jesus' lips.

There was never any question in the early church about women becoming disciples. Both Martha and Mary welcomed Jesus and the word he spoke (vv. 38-39). The controversy swirled around what women would do with what they learned while sitting at Jesus' feet. The answer Luke gave was quite understandable for his time. Today's gospel invites us to reflect on what answer Jesus might give today to the question of a woman's place in the ministries of the church.

Welcom ing God, Abraham invited your messengers into his tent and was rewarded with a son. Jesus went to Marthalls home, where she and Mary learned from you. Give us the wisdom to be hospitable to strangers, knowing that Christ is present in all we meet. Amen.






