




Corporal

of the altar, on top of the altar cloth. It is a place on which to rest the vessels containing the consecrated bread and wine, that is, the Body and Blood of Christ.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

The Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading—Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

In 597 B.C., Babylon (located in modern-day Iraq) defeated Jerusalem and thousands of Jewish leaders and citizens were taken into exile. The prophet Jeremiah was among those left behind. When he preached trust in God rather than armed revolution, the people considered him a traitor.

Second Reading—Hebrews 12:1-4

Commonly referred to as a letter, Hebrews is really a lengthy sermon that encourages people to remain faithful in difficult times. In the previous section, the author cited Old Testament witnesses who had done just that. In this week's reading, the author now points out the greatest example of fidelity.

Gospel Reading—Luke 12:49-53

We see a kind of tug-of-war in the first reading. Some heed the prophet's words and welcome his warning, while others resist the threat to their power, privilege, and status that Jeremiah's message poses. Jesus speaks of the same kind of divided reaction that his ministry provokes. As he ignites in his followers a vision of justice, peace, and well-being for all, some welcome it. Others resist the burning away of their comforts and privileges that Jesus' way of transformation demands.

Jesus warns his followers not to be surprised if his message provokes conflict and division. The way toward genuine peace is not a gentle, easy road. It's a path that entails struggle. Injustice does not die without heavy resistance. Those who embark on Jesus' way, however, are empowered by their baptism. Baptism brings both refreshment and joy from being washed of sin, as well as an induction into a difficult, lifelong burning away of anything within that stands opposed to the gospel. Inflamed with the power of the Spirit, those baptized in Christ are empowered to continue his mission of healing divisions, as diverse hearts and minds are fused into one in the furnace of Christ's love.

Lord Jesus Christ, you came to set the world on fire, and to free us from our sinfulness. In our time of need, we turn to you: Lord, come to our aid! May we not grow weary, but fix our eyes on you and take courage, knowing of your great love for us. Amen.
