


Liturgy of the Word

Dance and Pray


Join us Monday, September 8th at 6:30 PM in Classroom #1 (close to the Faith Formation Office).

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

The Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading—Wisdom 9:13-18

The book of Wisdom was written by a teacher who lived in Alexandria, Egypt, a center for Greek philosophy in the ancient world. Fearful that the Jewish people might be captivated by this secular wisdom, the author contrasts it with rich wisdom of God found in Jewish religious traditions. The ninth chapter presents a prayer of Solomon for wisdom, and today's reading is an excerpt from this prayer.

Second Reading—Philemon 9:10, 12-17

Philemon was a rich man with many servants, one of whom – Onesimus – escaped. He reached Paul in prison and converted to Christianity. In sending Onesimus back to Philemon, Paul gave him a letter to take with him, a portion of which we hear today.

Gospel Reading—Luke 14:25-33

The saying about hating one's own family members is jolting to our ears, as it was to Jesus' first followers. In Jesus' time, people did not conceive of themselves as individuals but derived their identity and social standing from their family, clan, village, and religious group. It would be unimaginable to cut oneself off from family; this would be tantamount to losing life itself.

Looking at other passages in the Gospel of Luke, we see that Jesus himself does not renounce his family. Unlike Mark (3:31-35), Luke (8:21) leaves open the possibility that Jesus' blood kin can also be disciples. In fact, Luke portrays Jesus' mother as one who faithfully hears the word of God and obeys; and in the story of Pentecost (Acts 1:14), Luke notes that Jesus' mother and siblings are among the disciples in the Upper Room. What Jesus asks, however, is that a disciple be willing to embrace as kin others who are not related by blood. Disciples must act as brother and sister toward those who are different, whether by physical ability or any other status marker.

God of all wisdom, in our haste and our pride, we often think we can "go it on our own." But Jesus reminds us that, as his disciples, we each must carry our own cross. Teach us your ways, that we may gain your wisdom and work toward building your kingdom. Amen.
