# Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross















# BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

# Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

# First Reading—Numbers 21:4-9

The book of Numbers describes the wanderings of the Jewish people in the Sanai Desert. Today's passage tells of a time when the people were complaining during their journey. Two things can help us understand this reading. First, we will hear of *saraph* serpents; *saraph* is a Hebrew word meaning fiery one. Second, Christians have seen in the bronze serpent placed on a pole a symbol of Jesus hanging on the cross.

## Second Reading—Philippians 2:6-11

In this portion of his letter to the Philippians, Paul quotes an early Christian hymn about Jesus to encourage the community to greater unity and humility.

## Gospel Reading—John 3:13-17

In the Saint John's Bible depiction of the crucifixion scene, both cross and Christ are pure gold, the total revelation of God's very self, shown against a cosmic background—this is an event that resounds through all time and space. By the love of Christ outpoured, the atrocity of the crucifixion becomes something profoundly beautiful. The cross is no longer simply an instrument of death but has become the means by which we are given abundant life.

In this courageous act of love, we find reason for hope and a decisive direction for our own life. We have no reason to fear either life or death, as God's redeeming love is enough for us. As was the case with the serpent in the desert, "lifted up" for all in search of healing to look upon, we are offered wholeness and redemption in gazing upon the cross. However, in turning to the cross, we also must recognize Jesus' destiny as our own. We, too, must be "lifted up" with Christ, born from above in baptism and thus united with him in his death and resurrection. If we love as Christ loves, we will not escape our own crosses.

Loving God, you sent your Son into the world that all might believe in him and have eternal life. As Jesus humbled himself by his death on the cross, may we also learn greater humility in our day-to-day interactions with others, and so glorify you by our lives. Amen.

# The Kids' Bulletin

Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross September 14th, 2025



Today is a special feast day when we celebrate the cross on which Jesus died. Look in the mirror to find the words of a hymn that tells us about what the cross means to us.

The Holy Cross

Today we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation, or Triumph, of the Holy Cross on which Our Lord died. The cross was an instrument of torture used to punish criminals and to show other people what would happen to them too, if they broke the Roman laws. Our Lord used the cross for a different reason though. He offered His sufferings on the cross to repay for the sins of everyone else in the world. He died in a place where many people could see Him so that they could see and know how much He loves us.

In the 300's AD, St. Helena, who was a Christian queen, went to Jerusalem to find the cross of Jesus. She found three crosses there so she decided to test to see which

was Christ's. A very sick woman touched each cross. When she touched the third one she was healed instantly! They had found the cross of Christ!



In hoc Saint Helena's son Constantine was signo, not a Christian yet, but when he was about to go to war he had a vision of the cross and heard the words "In this sign you shall conquer!" So he had crosses drawn on all the flags and shields, and he won the battle. Then he believed in Jesus and became a Christian.
