The word "catechesis" is from a Greek word meaning "to echo". All those who teach the Catholic faith and share the Church's teachings, by word and by the way they live their lives, are


catechists. The catechist's goal is always to set hearts aflame for Christ.

Conversion is a gradual process as well as a community and personal journey of faith that leads to a transformation of mind and spirit.



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading—Amos 8:4-7

Amos has been called the prophet of social justice. He lived about 750 B.C., a time of economic prosperity and religious corruption. Amos was a forceful and colorful preacher, as we will hear in today's passage.

Second Reading—1 Timothy 2:1-8


We continue to read from first Timothy, a letter written in Paul's name about 30 years after his death. Today's passage, drawing upon Paul's authority, teaches about public prayer. We will also hear quoted what may have been an early Christian creed.

Gospel Reading—Luke 16:1-13

Things aren't as simple as they used to be—or so it seems! Perhaps there never really was a time when issues were clear-cut and moral decisions were easy.

The parable in today's gospel is itself so complex that the only thing biblical scholars agree on is that it poses more questions than it answers, and no interpretation fully answers all of them. How can a dishonest steward be praised by his master? Who is the master? Jesus? The rich man? Is the parable about lost honor or lost income? What is the economic system presumed in the story? Does it concern usury? Or the steward's commission? What does "squandering" signify? Is the charge true or false? Who are the debtors? Is the master a sympathetic character or a villain? Is the steward someone to be emulated or is he designed to give us a chuckle?

One possibility for this Sunday is not to try to settle the interpretation of the gospel parable but to look instead at the underlying values and attitudes that the readings propose, which orient us toward what we must do in order to be able to make good moral decisions in complex situations.



Lord, out God, you know us and our failings, and yet you love us unconditionally. We praise you for raising up those in poverty, for we know ourselves to be poor in your sight. You have trusted us with much:

may we be found worthy of that trust.
