Synod Listening Update

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to join the Synod on Synodality, which is a two-year spiritual journey of listening and dialogue. You, too, are personally invited to give your feedback and views on the future of the Church through small group listening sessions.



As we begin our Synod process, Christ Our Hope encourages ALL of our parishioners to participate in the upcoming in-person or virtual listening sessions. In these sessions, gathered participants will engage with one another in meaningful dialogue on the future of Christ Our Hope as well as the whole Catholic Church.

At Christ our Hope, Synod Listening Sessions will be held both in-person and online. In preparation, we ask all to prayerfully reflect on the following questions prior to attending a Listening Session:

How is this "journeying together" happening today in your local Church? What experiences or stories of our local Church do these questions call to mind? Thinking on these experiences - What joys did they bring? What difficulties and obstacles have they encountered? What wounds did they reveal? What insights have they elicited? Where in these experiences does the voice of the Holy Spirit resound? What is the Spirit asking of us? What are the points to be confirmed, the prospects for change, the steps to be taken? What paths are opening up for our local Church?

Trees planted beside Pacific Northwest waters

In two different scriptures Sunday we hear the beautiful image of the blessed faithful as fruit-bearing trees flourishing by flowing waters At Sunday's 7:00 P.M. Mass we will pray, proclaim, and praise with music created by composers of the Pacific Northwest—musical trees bearing musical fruit by our flowing waters.

The five Northwest composers we will hear have created liturgical music for the Archdiocese of Seattle during the past 60 years. The great silent movie organist, Jean Anthony Grief

(1898-1981), composed an English setting of the Beatitudes during the second Vatican Council. Grief was born in Walla Walla, educated at Gonzaga and WSU, and played for silent films in Spokane, Seattle and Portland.

Bern Herbolsheimer (1948-2016), whose sublime setting of the "Beatitudes" our women will sing, was born in Kirkland, educated at the UW, taught at Cornish and served as Composerin-Residence at St. James from 1981-2014. The "Alleluia" we will sing was composed by Karen P. Thomas (b. 1957) for Archbishop Brunett's installation. Richard Proulx (1937-2010) composer/organist/friend founded the famous BoyChoir at St. Charles Borromeo's Tacoma. Dr. Bob Hurd (b. 1950) is SU professor of Ministry and Theology. His lovely "Ubi Caritas Mass" was premiered in Seattle. (AND! He is the cousin of Cathedral Pastor, Fr. Ryan!)
