Summer is finally here! It's the perfect time to lay back, relax and READ!


We are asking that the incoming second graders read <u>Flat Stanley</u> by Jeff Brown.


We have included a summer bingo reading sheet with suggested fun places to read. After reading <u>Flat Stanley</u>, please complete the attached reading packet.


