A MESSAGE FROM THE CLERGY

STAY AWAKE!

Our Lord advises us to be vigilant. He uses the example of daily work and household life, in which it is far too easy to get comfortable or even bored. In that state of acedia, a kind of spiritual laziness, we lose sight of what God is doing with us and with the people around us. And thus we lose the drama, the excitement, the hope, and the opportunity to cooperate with God's work.

In contrast, I want you to have all the joy and hope that comes with being Catholic. By this I mean:

• **Discipleship:** Even for me, forty years after I began to practice Christianity in greater earnest as an adult, after many years of advanced scholarship in theology and related subjects, and after 26 years of priestly ministry, Jesus continues to awe me.

It's not really enough to be a member of the "club" which is the Catholic Church: Membership is good, but the heartbeat of the Church is the Lord Jesus and her breath is the Holy Spirit, and we need these things really to live. If you're not yet aware of how Jesus is developing a friendship with you, then go to Alpha, see a spiritual director once or twice, or work it out some other way, but please, get to know Jesus!

- Catholicity: Be Catholic—and take care that being Catholic does not mean ceasing to be catholic. Far too many so-called Catholics are always trying to make being Catholic into something like a Protestant denomination, a group of Christians united around shared opinions on faith and morals. But for true Catholics, that (1) unity of faith and morals is only one aspect of our Catholicity. The other aspects are (2) our full sharing in the sacramental life, from Baptism to Holy Communion and everything else along the way, as our circumstances provide, and (3) a wholehearted commitment to our institutional life, under the pastoral governance of our Pope and Bishop, and striving always to build up the local Church of Pittsburgh and our own parish, Archangel Gabriel. People who ignore Church authorities or our institutional life damage Catholicity as much as those who ignore the Church's teachings on faith and morals.
- **Mission**: I know—better than most!—how tempting it is to blame troubles in the Church on one or another group: the progressives, the traditionalists, advocates of "the spirit" of Trent or Vatican II, bishops, priests, parents, teachers, laity. We find it appealing to imagine that we are the beleaguered remnant, while those around us tear down the Church. We imagine everything would be so much better, if only everyone were more like us! But, no, that's not how Christian mission works. Our mission is to help build each other up and evangelize the world, and not to make ourselves a small remnant. If one or another group is getting it wrong or failing in some way, then it's our *shared* responsibility to get it right, to find effective ways to cooperate with and strengthen one another—and thus together take the good news of Jesus to people who do not yet trust him or share in his life.

This is my closing column for my tenure as pastor of Archangel Gabriel Parish. I welcome my successor as pastor—but at least at the time of writing, I do not yet know who my successor will be. Again, I thank you for the ways in which you have helped me to be a better man, a better priest, and a better pastor.

The Sunday Gospel

Matthew 24:37-44

Many of us feel the pressure early in the holiday season to be ready for Christmas. But today's Gospel challenges us to be ready for something other than the gift-giving of Christmas.

Read together today's Gospel reading. As a family, talk about what it means to be ready for the day of the Lord. One of the roles of the family, the domestic church, is to be a school of faith leading one another to salvation. Reflect together as a family on how your family helps one another

Our Extended Family

Servant of God Thea Bowman (Feast Day March 30) December 29, 1937-March 30, 1990

Born and raised in Canton, Mississippi, Bertha Elizabeth Bowman was the daughter of a physician and a teacher. She converted to Catholicism as a child, after learning about the faith from her teachers, who were Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual



Adoration, and Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity. Bertha was drawn to the example of how Catholics love and care for each other, but most notably, she knew that God was indeed the God of the poor and oppressed.

At the age of 15, Bertha left her home in Mississippi to enter the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration in LaCrosse, Wisconsin. She was the only African American member in the convent and took the name Sister Mary Thea. Sister Thea was inspired by the Second Vatican Council to rediscover her African American religious heritage and spirituality; she used her knowledge of her culture to inform her work in service to the Gospel. She became a highly acclaimed evangelist, teacher, writer, and singer, known for enriching the message of God's love with the beauty of her African American culture. Sr. Thea was instrumental in the 1987 publication of Lead Me, Guide Me: The African American Catholic Hymnal.

When she returned to her hometown to care for her aging parents, Sr. Thea worked with the Diocese of Jackson to build intercultural awareness in the Church. She gave inspirational presentations to Black congregations all over the United States and the world, calling Catholics to celebrate their differences and retain their cultures in a way that was faithful to the Church and celebrated being one in Christ. Sr. Thea died in 1990 after a six-year battle with breast cancer.

Cooking Together Mississippi Mud Pudding

Enjoy this delicious recipe in honor of Mississippi-born Thea Bowman!

1 cup all-purpose flour 1 cup chopped pecans ½ cup butter, softened 1 package (5.9 oz.) instant chocolate pudding mix

1 package (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

1 cup confectioners' sugar 1 container (16 oz.) frozen whipped topping, thawed, divided Toasted chopped pecans and chocolate curls, optional

Preheat oven to 350 F. In a large bowl, beat flour, pecans and butter until blended. Press into the bottom of a 13 x 9-in. baking dish. Bake until golden brown, about 15 minutes. Remove to a wire rack; cool completely.

Make chocolate pudding according to package directions; let stand 5 minutes. In a bowl, beat cream cheese and sugar until smooth; fold in 1 cup whipped topping. Spread cream cheese mixture over cooled crust. Spread pudding over cream cheese layer, top with remaining whipped topping. If desired, top with additional pecans and chocolate curls.

THOSE PASSING FROM DEATH INTO NEW LIFE


