A MESSAGE FROM THE CLERGY

HE MUST INCREASE, I MUST DECREASE

It is odd that we celebrate a prophet in the midst of his suffering as we do with John the Baptist. We are not used to conflict in our hearts. Let it be easier one way or the other. And yet, that isn't how Christ sends His message. We praise John for his holiness and his witness while he is in prison. Jesus does the same because He wants us to see a prime example of love through suffering. John leads the way to Christ through his generous spirit in his prayer, in his ministry, and in his discipleship. Why does John ask, through his disciples, if Jesus is "He who is to come" or "should we look for another?" There is no need for him to be sure because John already knows through the grace of God. If he, as a child in his mother Elizabeth's womb, could know the closeness of his Lord in the womb of our Blessed Mother, how much more now? John draws all to hear his message so he could send them forth to find the Word made flesh.

In a similar way, the response Jesus gives does not so much assure John as to give living examples to those John sent, thus drawing them more to Himself. The time of John the Baptist must decrease as the time of Jesus must increase. We celebrate in rose-colored vestments not just to signify our close proximity to the celebration of our Lord's birth. We also celebrate the joyful passage of message to the Word, of sacrifice that is limited to life that endures and from hopefulness to realization of the presence of Christ. The light of dawn is being exchanged for the light of the morning. More of the revelation of Christ is being revealed for us. Let us continue to strive for the love of our Lord and to open our hearts to Him.

Service of Love - Prayer Blanket Ministry

Please join us in making fleece tie blankets for our homeless brothers and sisters in Christ on **Wednesday, December 14 from 6-8PM in Weirauch Hall at the St. Malachy campus**. We will be donating these blankets to Catholic Charities to use in their warming centers and ARA Dialysis Center at Heritage Valley- Kennedy.

You will need to bring 1 and 1/2 yards of 2 coordinating fleece fabrics (3 yards total) or you can purchase a fleece tie kit size 40 x 60 inches and a SHARP pair of FABRIC scissors. If you have never made a fleece tie blanket, we will show you how to do it. Families or school age children with an adult can easily do this. During our meeting we pray over the blankets, so these can be given to anyone in need of prayer.

If you would like to participate by making a fleece tie blanket or you crochet or knit, you can make your blanket at home and drop off at our meeting or make arrangements to have it picked up. Third Sunday of Advent

The Sunday Gospel

Matthew 11:2-11

It is easy to look at our world and become discouraged by the apparent absence of God and signs of God's salvation. Advent, however, is a season of hope, in which we acknowledge that salvation is both mysteriously present, even in our world, and yet to be fulfilled.

Read together today's Gospel. Think about John's question to Jesus: Are you the One? Jesus does not answer directly, but points to the signs of the kingdom present in his midst.

JESUS TELLS JOHN THE BAPTIST OF THE SIGNS OF THE KINGDOM THAT ARE BEING WORKED THROUGH HIM AND PRAISES JOHN AS MORE THAN A PROPHET.

Together as a family, look through the newspaper for signs of hope that God is at work in our world. Pray that the world will know God's salvation by praying together the Lord's Prayer.

The third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday often symbolized with the color rose or pink. Where do you see this color at your parish today?

Our Extended Family

St. Rose of Lima (Feast Day August 23) April 20, 1586-August 24, 1617

St. Rose was born in Lima, Peru.
She admired
St. Catherine of
Siena and was devout in her faith practices, such as fasting regularly, performing secret penances, and receiving the Eucharist daily.



She did not want to marry, but her parents refused to let her enter a convent to become a nun. So, while she lived at home, she joined the Third Order of St. Dominic. She devoted as much time as she could to prayer, even giving up sleep to pray more. She only slept about two hours each night. She wore a thick silver crown on her head, with studs on the inside, like a crown of thorns. She was incredibly devoted to Christ and lived a life of prayer.

To help her family, Rose sold flowers during the day and sewed. She also built a small hut in the family garden to care for the elderly, homeless children, and the sick. All were welcome. This led to the start of social services in Peru.

Rose died at the age of 31. It is said that the city smelled like roses at the time of her death. The leaders of the city attended her funeral. Many miracles were attributed to her after her death. There are places all over North and South America that are named Santa Rosa after her. She is the first person to be canonized who was born in the Americas.

Cooking Together Church Window Cookies

Make some cookies that look like stained glass windows today!

1 package (12 oz.) chocolate chips

1 package (10 oz.) miniature pastel-colored marshmallows 1/4 cup salted butter or oleo 1 cup walnuts or pecans 1 package (14 oz.) shredded coconut

Melt butter and chocolate chips over low heat. Stir constantly. Once blended together, let cool for 5 minutes. In a large bowl, stir the cooled mixture over the marshmallows. Add the nuts and blend well. Sprinkle coconut generously on a piece of wax paper. Then form a roll with the mixture approximately 2 ½ inches wide on the wax paper; make 2 to 4 rolls. Wrap tightly in wax paper or foil; leave enough paper to twist the ends like a candy wrapper. Chill or freeze. Slice to serve.
