A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

ABORTION LAW AND JURISPRUDENCE

Almost two weeks ago, we saw a leaked Supreme Court draft opinion suggesting that the landmark case, Roe v. Wade, might be overturned. Catholic thought on abortion begins with the 5th of the 10 Commandments: "You shall not kill" [Catechism of the Catholic Church, §§2270-2275]. The Church understands the 5th commandment in two senses:

- 1. as divine confirmation of human reason, according to which it is unethical directly and deliberately to kill a non-aggressive human being [CCC 2261];
- 2. as a gateway to life in Christ, who brings the moral law to its completion in his perfect love and obedience, and who invites his followers to a life of full integrity and interior peace, eschewing even angry words for others: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not kill and whoever kills shall be liable to judgment,' but I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment" [CCC 2262]

Thus, from the beginning, Christians discerned an obligation not to kill children before or after birth. As centuries passed and we learned more biology of reproduction, we recognized that new and distinctive life occurs long before birth, as early as conception. So we speak of the sin of procured abortion, that is, the direct and deliberate killing of an unborn child. Procured abortions do not include indirect abortions, such as the removal of an ectopic pregnancy, or an abortion resulting from treatment necessary for other medical reasons. Nor do they include spontaneous miscarriages, which are all too common and often a source of much grief for parents.

Christians also abstain from formal cooperation—that is, approving or encouraging a procured abortion—and immediate material cooperation, such as paying for abortion or handing over the instruments or drugs used for abortion.

The Church also proposes to humanity that unborn children must be respected as persons from conception. Respect includes the protection of the law and ordinary medical and material care, which becomes the duty of every civil society and its government. Civil authorities must discern how best to implement this respect in law and policy. In my personal opinion, the best law would protect the unborn not primarily by punishing perpetrators, as we do with some forms of murder, but with the circumspection due for special offenses against the 5th commandment, e.g.: suicide attempts, euthanasia, or systemic threats to public health and safety, such as domestic violence or school bullying.

Most pro-life commentators welcome the overturning of Roe v. Wade as the removal of a major impediment to laws that might otherwise begin to address the proposals above. But by itself, overturning Roe does nothing to protect or care for unborn children or their mothers. If Roe is overturned, Catholics will need to turn much more attention to state legislatures in order to advance legislation that provides the necessary protection and care.

Every year, Archangel Gabriel Parish undertakes several "pro-life" campaigns. Some of these protest the withdrawal of legal protections from unborn persons. Others collect funds or other material support for mothers and children at risk. The parish could make this a higher priority as needed. For more information or to help, please contact the parish office.




CONGRATULATIONS AND WELCOME TO JACE ERIC BOYLAN





FIRST READING — ACTS 14: 21-27

After Paul and Barnabas had proclaimed the good news to that city and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch. They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith.

Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia. From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished. And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

THE NICENE CREED


