A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

HOLY TRINITY

Today's credal feast commemorates the revelation from Jesus that God is one Being and three divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It's not something that humans would have guessed at simply by using their own reasoning. And yet, it's a revelation at the center of our faith, requiring trust and acceptance from us for the sake of our salvation. God is communion, that is, shared life and love.

On a practical level, Jesus' revelation of God as three Persons also suggests that no one gets to Heaven alone. The process of our salvation, our spiritual healing, requires that we both receive and give help to others. In this way, we begin to practice the shared life and love which is the earthly beginning of our heavenly life.

Just as you would beware "Christians" who boast of their individual spiritual heroism, as if they did not receive saving grace through others' hands, so also beware "Christians" whose first concern is not how they can help others receive the same grace they first received.

At Archangel Gabriel Parish, one of our churches is dedicated to the Holy Trinity. We'll take the occasion to substitute the Litany of the Holy Trinity in place of the Universal Prayer.

More Thoughts for the Week

- The Reverend Mister Jacob Gruber was ordained to the transition diaconate last Saturday, June 4. I saw several of you at the ceremony; thanks for coming and praying for Deacon Jacob! He has been assigned again to Archangel Gabriel Parish for the summer and for his holidays through next June, when he is expected to be ordained to the priesthood. It is an honor for our parish to be entrusted with the pastoral formation of a new priest. Please give him your full attention this summer as he preaches frequently for us!
- Tim Davis, Ron Cross, Eric Cross and Karl Foerster have dismantled the pro tem stage they erected last year in the front windows of St. Malachy Church. The stage greatly augmented our parish ministry to those with a low tolerance for risk during the pandemic. I am grateful to them and to all who labored to make possible the outdoor adoration and the "parking lot" Mass. Thank you also to everyone who has committed themselves to adoring our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration, and thank you for your flexibility as we attempt a new trial schedule at all three of our church campuses.
- Property Expenses: Among our parish expenses, the single greatest is the maintenance of our property: property and liability insurance, the salaries and benefits of maintenance staff, contracted services (e.g. snow removal, landscaping), property taxes, maintenance and custodial supplies, and the occasional project (such as last year's roofing repairs at St. Mary Church, or the anticipated replacement of broken doors at Holy Trinity Church). Over the previous fiscal year, the combined expense for property maintenance was about \$627,000, or 31% of our parish revenues. That's a high overhead cost for the parish to bear, even before we come around to administrative overhead. But as most of you know all too well, we are many years behind in caring for our properties as they ought to be cared for. Your gifts to the parish make it possible for me to do a better job of maintaining our parish properties without sacrificing the efforts so essential to our mission and growth.

JACOB GRUBER ORDAINED AS TRANSITIONAL DEACON

Auxiliary Bishop Mark A. Eckman ordained three seminarians as transitional deacons in the presence of Bishop David Zubik on Saturday, June 4 at 10:00 AM at St.Therese Church of St.Thomas the Apostle Parish: Jacob H. Gruber at Theological College and the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC; and Daniel J. D'Antonio and Thomas G. Kadlick at St. Vincent Seminary in Latrobe, PA.

Transitional deacons are men who are in their final stages of preparation for the Catholic priesthood. They have spent at least six years in priestly formation, which includes academic studies in philosophy and theology, growth in virtue and a life of prayer and immersion in service work in the community, among other things.



Catholic deacons are ordained for two primary roles: service at the altar in the celebration of the sacraments and works of charity in the community. Deacons assist the priest and can preach the homily

at Mass; they can also baptize and can celebrate weddings and funerals that do not take place during Mass. Through works of charity, deacons serve at soup kitchens and food banks, visit the elderly and infirm in personal care homes, visit those in prison, and lead programs such as Bible studies at their parishes.

Following his second year of theology at Theological College and the Catholic University of America, Jacob was assigned to the parishes of Holy Trinity in Robinson Township, Saint John of God in McKees Rocks, and Saint Malachy in Kennedy Township, for his pastoral year assignment. Effective June 14, 2022, Deacon Jacob has been re-assigned to Archangel Gabriel Parish until his priestly ordination. Please join us in congratulating him and welcoming him back to our parish community.



COOKING TOGETHER

NO-BAKE STRAWBERRY CHEESECAKE PARFAIT

Strawberries were planted in medieval Trinity gardens because of their threepointed leaves. Celebrate with these light and delicious no-bake strawberry cheesecake parfaits.

Ingredients

- 2 pounds strawberries, stemmed and sliced
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 8 ounces reduced-fat cream cheese
- ½ cup plain non-fat Greek yogurt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ cup confectioner's sugar
- 1-½ cups frozen non-fat whipped topping, thawed, divided
- 3/3 cup graham cracker crumbs

Instructions

- In bowl, sprinkle the stemmed and sliced strawberries with sugar. Gently toss to combine and set aside while you make the "cheesecake cream."
- In mixing bowl, beat cream cheese, yogurt, and confectioners sugar until smooth. Gently stir in ½ cup whipped topping.
- To assemble parfaits, divide the ingredients among 8 dishes or glasses. Layer graham cracker crumbs, cream cheese filling, and strawberries.
- Repeat layers and end with a dollop of whipped topping.

THE SUNDAY GOSPEL

JN 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. THE GIFT OF SELFLESS LOVE

Think of the last time you witnessed an act of selfless love in your family. Parents and caregivers of all kinds are called upon to act selflessly every day. Family life calls us to share selfless love with one another.

God is the model for us of selfless love. There was no need for God to create our planet or the creatures that inhabit it; it was an act of selfless love. There was also no need for God to send his only Son to save us. That too was an act of selfless love.

As we draw closer to God and the mystery of the Trinity, we learn about God's love. God has lavished us with love in the persons of the Son and the Spirit, who in turn nurture in us the desire to do the same. When we open ourselves to be filled with an awareness of the divine life within us, we participate in the endless spiral of love that leads to eternal life. Whenever we share selfless love in the family, we are sharing in the life of the Trinity.






