DRAWN TO WORSHIP IN THE LITURGY

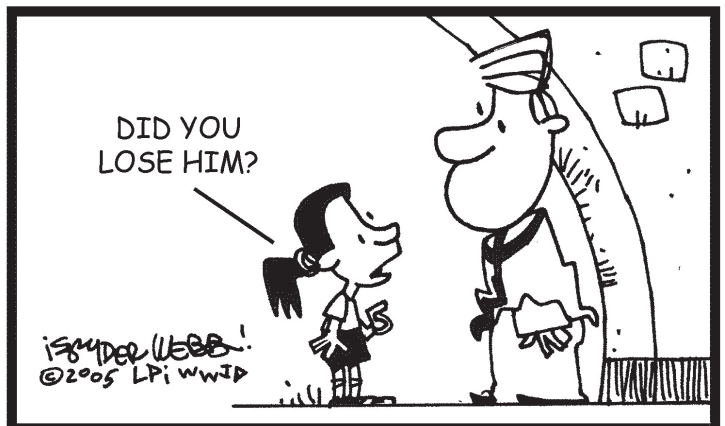
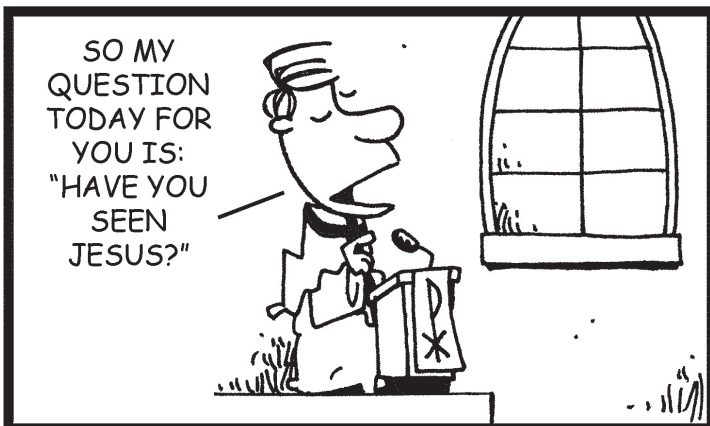
John the Baptist is still at work! He is pointing out who the Lamb of God is. This is his mission. Through Advent we were awakened by his voice and his message to look for the dawning of Christ. We celebrated the birth of Jesus through the season of Christmas in a spirit of joy. We enter our first full week of Ordinary Time with the question of "what is next for us?". That "next" is our identifying who we are as members of the Body of Christ and acting on what the Lord needs us to do as witnesses to His mission. With that, we also need to look at what draws us here to worship, what are the guidelines that facilitate our worship and how the liturgical environment in our worship space reflects the guidelines of the Church.

Today we hear "it is too little for you to be my servant" and "I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." Christ wants to raise you up! He is speaking to your heart to be an active disciple for Him! He sees so much more in you than you see in yourself. You can do so much more in His name when you believe in yourself in the same way He believes in you! At the same time, that same Holy Spirit calls us to believe in each other and to believe in what each of us can do for the parish of Archangel Gabriel. We are called to make active our spiritual desire to build up THIS body of Christ.

Our focus must be drawn to the message and our liturgical environment does that for us. We receive hospitality from God and, therefore, we must in the same prayerful spirit extend hospitality to each other. This mutual respect is the foundation of the celebration of the Mass. The Church documents teach us about the liturgy. We see a fourfold presence of Christ when we come together in worship, 1) in the people gathered, 2) in the Word of God proclaimed, 3) in the minister who presides, and 4) in the Eucharist. The décor of our worship spaces for parish celebration should acknowledge this. Such decoration of our worship spaces never takes its cue from secular fashion, but from liturgical principles. What we do at home should never translate to how we adorn our worship spaces in Church. The Roman rite of Catholic liturgy is never elaborate for its own sake, but direct and focused for OUR sake. Accumulation distracts us from the liturgy itself and its message. Therefore, less is more.

Next week we will look at the published norms for liturgy in the document "Built of Living Stones" from the U.S. Catholic Bishops. We will continue discussing the liturgical norms for each of our liturgical seasons through the last Sunday before Lent.

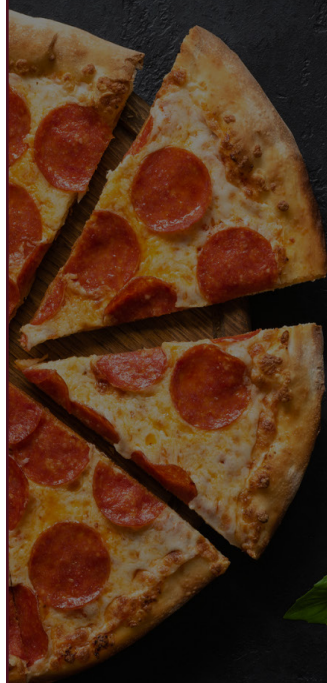

He has published fourteen books, including: Mass Exodus: Catholic Disaffiliation in Britain and America since Vatican II and Nonverts: The Making of Ex-Christian America. Stephen and his wife Joanna are raising their four children in England.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Sunday Gospel

John 1:29-34

The ministry of John the Baptist prepared for and pointed to the ministry of Jesus. In a similar way, our lives are to offer testimony to who we know Jesus to be for us and for the world. Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. How does the witness of our lives give testimony to the reconciling presence of Christ?

As a family, identify as many titles for Jesus as possible, such as Lamb of God, Son of God, Prince of Peace, and so on. Talk together about what these different titles mean and what they tell you about Jesus. Then read together today's Gospel, John 1:29-34.

Consider how John the Baptist gives testimony to who Jesus is. Talk about what people might come to know about Jesus by observing your family life. Pray together that your family life will show others that Jesus is the Son of God, the lamb who takes away the sins of the world. Pray the Lord's Prayer.

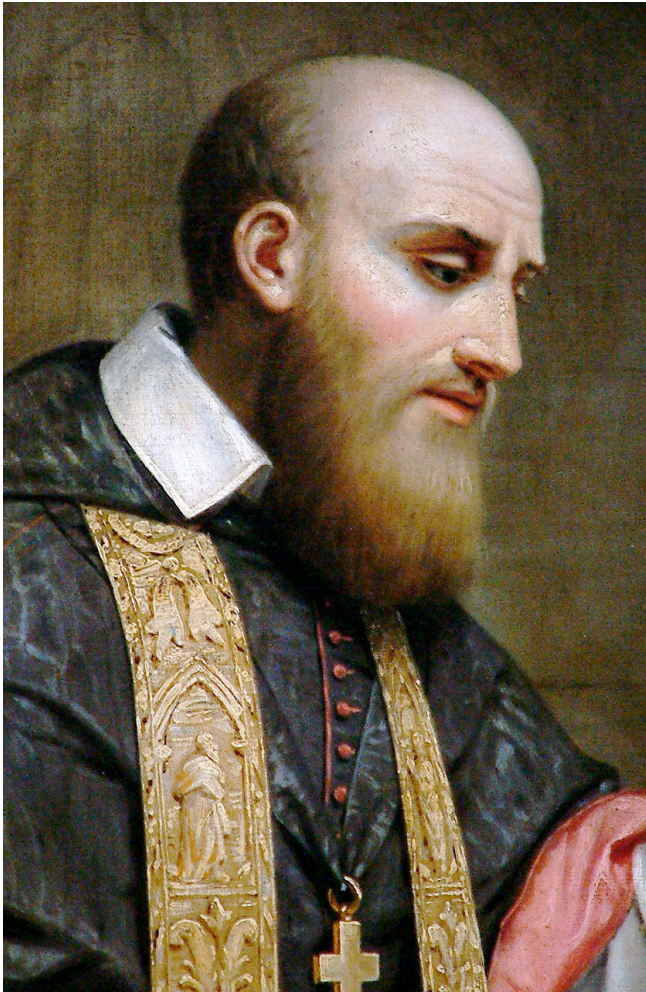

Our Extended Family

St. Francis de Sales

(Feast Day January 24)

August 21, 1567 – December 28, 1622



After earning a doctorate in law, St. Francis wished to enter the priesthood. At age 35, he became the bishop of Geneva. St. Francis became known for his deep faith and his gentle approach to the religious divisions in his land resulting from the Protestant Reformation. Francis is well-known for his book, *Introduction to the Devout Life*, which is still available for purchase today. His writings, filled with his gentle spirit, are addressed to lay people. He wanted to make them understand that they too, are called to be saints.

Cooking Together: Easy Noodle Bake

1 pound ground beef
1 small onion chopped
2 cloves garlic minced
1 jar spaghetti sauce (Barilla Tomato Basil)
Garlic salt
Margarine
1 box rotini noodles
Shredded mozzarella cheese
Parmesan Cheese

Brown ground beef with onions and garlic. Drain. Sprinkle with garlic salt to taste. Pour in spaghetti sauce. Simmer 5 minutes. Cook noodles according to directions. Drain. Mix in 1 Tbsp margarine. Sprinkle with garlic salt. Pour in spaghetti sauce and mix well. Transfer to baking dish. Sprinkle top with mozzarella cheese and parmesan cheese. Bake at 350 F until cheese is bubbly.
