## A MESSAGE FROM OUR CLERGY

### AN EXTENSION OF GOD'S BLESSINGS

What God has revealed to you and about you by the light of Christ He also awaits our acknowledgement of what we have learned about ourselves. First and foremost, all we have received from God is unmerited gift. Out of his eternal love we are showered with grace. All of our accomplishments come from Him who has loved us first. Reflecting on this and understanding our being freely chosen by the Lord to do His loving will, should this not move us to deep humility? Put into perspective, our lives are an opportunity to love and praise God in every interaction we have with another person. It is this context that Paul tells us to consider our own situation as well as our relationship with Christ.

Jesus knows how much we need what He has to give. How much more should be our knowing ourselves as bearers of the Lord who are an extension of His blessings upon us. In fact, we are blessings to each other! It may be said that all the teaching of Jesus to His disciples is twofold; extend a blessing because you are a blessing. Our humility embraces an acceptance of this role. There is no expectation of what is due to us but, rather, a continual joy in bringing the experience of Christ's love to each other. In both sides of each relationship, we bless and we are blessed.

Our liturgical space reflects our devotion to the Lord. The five focal points of ritual action in the liturgy draw and keep our attention to what is most important in our highest celebration of prayer. The first is the assembly area, for we, the assembled, are the primary liturgical ministers. How we instruct and encourage the people to participate in the liturgy is important. Our postures, movements, words, songs and attentive focus on the celebration share our acting as the one body of Christ. We can further demonstrate this by, for example, wearing red for Pentecost. The second is the altar, upon which our Holy Eucharist is celebrated. It is always covered with a white cloth that reaches from corner to corner. Third, the ambo is where we proclaim the Word of God. Fourth, the presider chair is the seat of Christ and who acts in persona Christi, the presiding priest, represents Him. And fifth, the baptistry is the font of life through which all become members of the Body of Christ. Concerning the tabernacle, it is never to be highlighted as a focus point since the liturgical action of the Mass happens from the five focal points noted above.

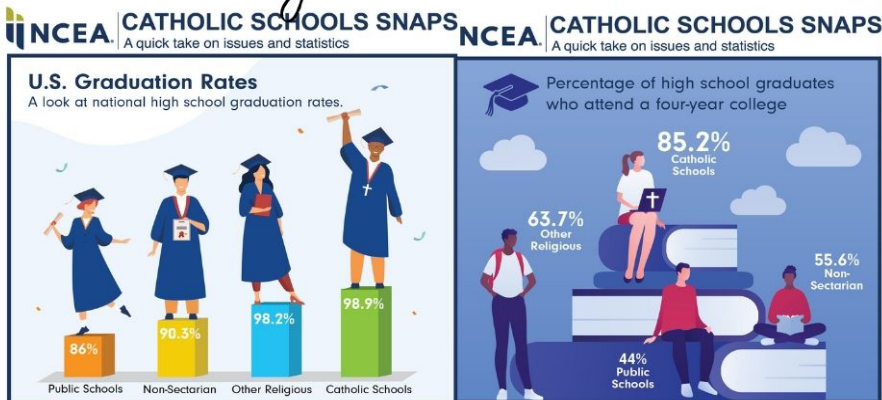

# Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

---

## The Sunday Gospel

Matthew 5:1-12a

Today's Gospel offers a contrast to many of the messages we hear in our society today. If we were to accept uncritically the "get ahead" messages of our culture, we would think that happiness means having money, being successful, having many possessions, and so on. When we think this way, we are not unlike the people who heard Jesus teach on the day that he taught the Beatitudes. The crowd that day also associated happiness with material possessions and status.

Talk as a family about what it means to be happy or to be blessed. Make a list of traits that you would associate with a happy person. Then read together today's Gospel, Matthew 5:1-12a. Reflect on Jesus' description of happiness. Think about what each of the Beatitudes might have in common and write a family summary of the Beatitudes. Post the summary in a special place as a reminder of what your family will consider "true happiness."

Conclude by praying together prayers of petition based on the Beatitudes, e.g., "We pray that we will be peacemakers who seek to get along with other people even when this is difficult. We pray to the Lord." All respond: "Lord, hear our prayer."

## Family Challenge

Invite each family member to choose one beatitude from the Gospel, but don't share it with anyone. Try to live that beatitude for a whole week. At the end of the week, try to guess which beatitude each person selected.

## Take Time to Chat

- What does it mean to be poor in spirit? Why do you think Jesus lifts this up as a desirable trait?
- What does it mean to be merciful? Do you think you are merciful? Explain your answer.
- What are some ways that people today are persecuted or insulted for following Jesus? What encouragement would you give them?



# Our Extended Family

St. John Bosco

(Feast Day January 31)

August 16, 1815 – January 31, 1888



John Bosco was born in Becchi, Italy. He was ordained a priest in 1841 and became a spiritual father to thousands of children. He started a school for poor boys, many of whom he met when he visited their parents in prison as part of his priestly work. These boys lived on the streets or in prisons. He started a school where they could eat and sleep safely. Later, John began a similar school for poor girls. John Bosco educated the whole person—body and soul. He believed that Christ's love and our faith in that love should permeate everything we do—work, study, and play. For John Bosco, being a Christian was a full-time effort, not a once-a-week, Mass-on-Sunday experience. John started the Salesians—a group of priests who helped boys—and the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians—a group of nuns who helped girls. (The Salesian name came from his devotion to St. Francis de Sales.) In 1875, he sent his first group of missionaries to the Americas.

## Cooking Together: Bosco Sticks

*Bosco sticks are breadsticks that are stuffed with mozzarella cheese and coated with butter and Parmesan. They are often served with marinara sauce. While the store-bought kind are delicious, the homemade ones are even tastier. Honor St. John Bosco by making this awesome and easy Bosco Sticks recipe.*

2 pounds of pizza dough  
16 skim mozzarella cheese sticks  
Extra-virgin olive oil, to taste  
Garlic powder, to taste  
Oregano, to taste  
Kosher salt, to taste  
1 cup of shredded Parmesan cheese (optional)  
Tomato sauce, for dipping

Preheat your oven to 400 F. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Take pizza dough, roll out into a rectangle, and place mozzarella string cheese per 1.5 inches of dough and cut into 1.5 inch strips. Wrap dough around string cheese, rolling as you go to form perfect breadsticks.

Bake for about 15 minutes or until barely golden. Remove from oven, brush with melted butter and sprinkle with garlic powder, oregano, parmesan, and salt as desired. Wait 5 minutes for the Bosco sticks to cool before serving them. Serve with pasta sauce for dipping. Super easy and so delicious!

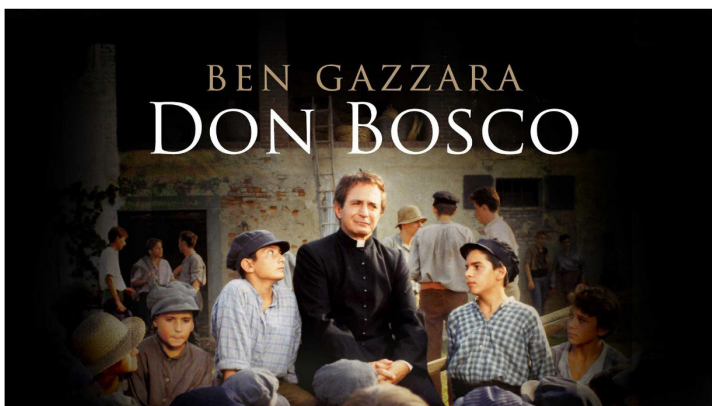
