FORMING THE PEARLS OF FAITH

For a pearl to form in a clam, there must be sand to irritate its soft tissue and begin that process of growth. Left to itself and its comfort, no pearl will form, and no benefit will be gained. Whether we like it or not, the work of the Holy Spirit has to irritate us as well in order for us to see a different plan from the one we became comfortable with by our own design. Many times, we do not see anything wrong with our plan. We become complacent in our comfort zone, and we settle rather than strive.

It is with this in mind that we need to see what the first reading shares with us. We become accustomed to settled practices as repetition breeds contentment. What we fail to focus on is that God chooses to work in unconventional ways. It was natural for Hebrews to look after their own, and it was not surprising that the

Greeks were left unattended. What is comfortable and normal does not make excluding others acceptable. The first deacons were prayed over and given the task to distribute pastoral care evenly to all who believed in the Risen Lord. It may have been irritating to be stretched out of their comfort zones, but it was the way the Lord chose to increase the number of the faithful and to teach the majority that the minority has very valuable gifts to bring to His table.

We see here a lack of awareness of how God works among us in both breadth and in depth. We are being stretched for a holy purpose as we are being prepared to be truly Christ-like. In the example of Thomas and Philip, we cannot be content with what we think we know of God. We are being challenged every day to know Him more fully and to accept His will more completely. Let us open ourselves to becoming missionary disciples in ways we have not entertained before.

We welcome Lilly Hinchenberger into the Roman Catholic faith this weekend through the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and Eucharist. She has been well-prepared, and we welcome her into the life of our parish. Congratulations Lilly!

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL UPDATE

The Parish Pastoral Council, which meets monthly, is currently reviewing the Pastoral Plan that was developed in 2020-2021. Councilors will also be meeting with the "Pillar Captains," those who were responsible for leading the work in the Pastoral Plan, to gain an understanding of the progress that has been made.

Once we have results from the DMI "Next Generation Parish" survey, we will begin to work with a consultant from the Catholic Leadership Institute. Our goal is to use the current Pastoral Plan as the baseline for a new Pastoral Plan, incorporating feedback from parishioners gathered through the survey.



EXPLORING OUR FAITH

Fifth Sunday of Easter

The Sunday Gospel

John 14:1-12

Members of the same family often bear close resemblances to one another. Sometimes physical resemblances are shared within a family, but often the similarities are behavioral characteristics and mannerisms. We hear this observation affirmed through a number of common phrases: "He's a chip off the old block," or

"She's her mother's daughter." Today's Gospel points to a mystery of faith that might be examined in light of these familial relationships. In Jesus we see and know the Father. Likewise, the Father is known through the life and work of the Son, Jesus.

Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the way and the truth and the life."

Talk together as a family about whether people outside of your family recognize common traits of your family. Are there physical resemblances that people recognize

and so know each individual as a member of your family? Are there mannerisms that are shared by members of your family? What are some common interests and work that people might associate with your family? As you read today's Gospel, John 14:1-12, keep in mind that members of the same family share many characteristics, even though each person in the family is an individual. What does Jesus tell his disciples about his relationship with the Father? The relationship between the Father and Jesus is so close that Jesus says that those who have seen and known Jesus have also seen and known the Father. Jesus promises his disciples that because of their faith in him and in the Father, they too will be able to do the work of the Father as Jesus did. End your discussion by praying together that others will recognize in your family the work of the Father. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

Family Prayer Challenge

In the month of May, we remember Mary, the Mother of God, in a special way. A beautiful way to honor Mary is to pray a rosary. - What does Jesus mean when he says, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father"?
- Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled." What does that mean to you?
- What does Jesus mean when he says, "I am going to prepare a place for you"?
- St. Kateri displayed great courage to become a Christian. Share a time when you had to be courageous.

Our Extended Family

St. Kateri Tekakwitha (Feast Day July 14) 1656 – April 17, 1680



Patron saint of the environment and the first Native American saint, Kateri was born in Auriesville, NY. Her mother was a Christian Algonquin, taken captive by the Iroquois and given as wife to the chief of the Mohawk clan. When she was four, she lost her parents and little brother in a smallpox epidemic and was adopted by an uncle, who succeeded her father as chief. Tekakwitha was moved by the words of three missionaries who lodged with her uncle. She refused to marry a Mohawk brave, converted at age 19, and was baptized with the name Kateri Catherine on Easter Sunday.

After her conversion, she was treated as a slave. She eventually stole away and made a 200-mile walk to a Christian Indian village near Montreal. For three years, she grew in holiness under the direction of a priest and an older Iroquois woman, giving herself to God in long hours of prayer and charity, and practicing strenuous penance. At 23, Kateri took a vow of virginity, an unprecedented act for a Native American woman whose future depended on being married. She was beatified in 1980 and canonized in 2012.

Cooking Together: St. Kateri Corn Bread

Since Native Americans introduced grinding corn meal, which led to the birth of corn bread (an early American staple), you may want to try this recipe.

Ingredients

½ cup butter or margarine, softened ¼ cup granulated sugar

2 large eggs

1 cup milk

1 cup all-purpose flour

1 cup yellow cornmeal

1 Tbsp baking powder ½ tsp salt

Instructions

Preheat oven to 375 F. Grease an 8-inch square baking pan; set aside. Combine butter with sugar and eggs in a large mixing bowl. Blend in milk, flour, cornmeal, baking powder, and salt until the batter is just blended (a few lumps are ok).

Pour batter into prepared pan and bake for about 25 minutes or until surface springs back lightly when touched and a toothpick stuck into the center comes out clean. Remove from oven and place pan onto a wire rack; serve hot or warm.
