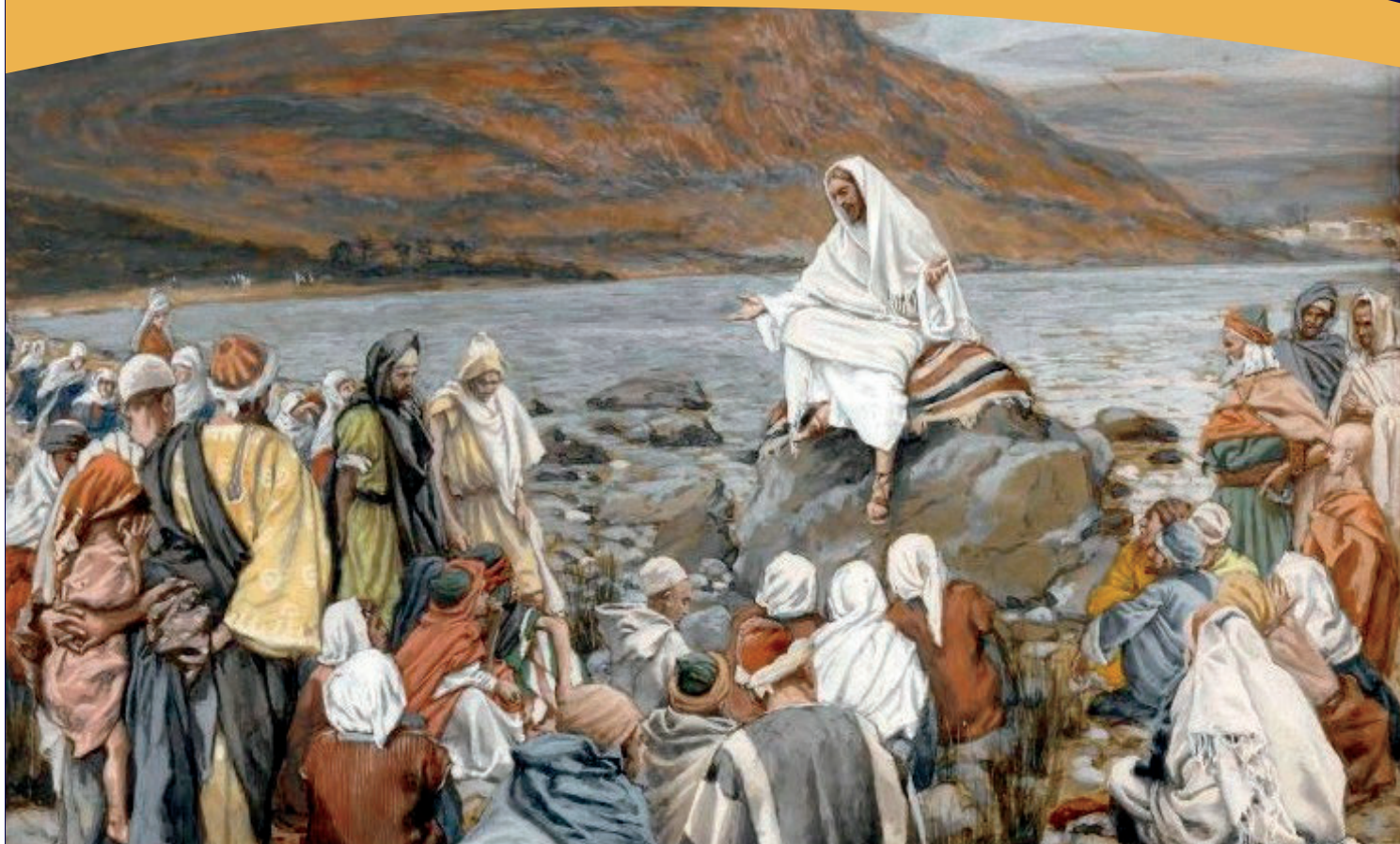

CELEBRATION OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

A celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will take place after the 11:00 AM Mass at St. Mary, Help of Christians Church on Sunday, February 19. Priests will be available for confessions from 9:30-10:30 AM. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness, upcoming surgery, or old age, the fitting time for them to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age. The Anointing of the Sick is one of two sacraments of healing, the other being the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Those who wish to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick are encouraged to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation also.

WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day to globally honor and pray for women and men in consecrated life, held annually on February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. The celebration of World Day for Consecrated Life is held this weekend: February 4-5, 2023. There are several ways to celebrate World Day for Consecrated Life: 1) Send cards of support to those in consecrated life, 2) Ask to visit a motherhouse to meet and pray with sisters, brothers, and priests, or 3) Send flowers, make a donation to a religious community, or invite someone to discern their vocation to consecrated life.

LIVING OUT THE MISSION

We are always invited to give generously to the poor so they may not have to struggle meeting their basic needs. Our service ministries of St. Vincent de Paul, the Food Pantry, and our Ladies of Charity, along with the FOR in McKees Rocks, are an extension of our pastoral care. Your contributions of time, treasure and talent enable these to fulfill their baptismal call. The messages in our Liturgy of the Word today also make this clear. None of this is new. We have heard various forms of this message many times. Part of the continual asking is an appeal to our hearts and minds to contribute to the efforts of bringing the active Catholic Christian witness to those in need. Individual and group efforts like the Boy/ Cub Scouts do their part as well, though more can be done throughout the year.

Last week I asked us to think and pray about what Christ both knows about us and needs to see coming from us in order to become true missionary disciples. This should lead us to humbly acknowledge our role in this life as the Lord sees it. The big question is why we as a people of God don't do more when we have the resources to do so? We have the physical and spiritual means to be people of charity and of ministry. All of our outreach ministries need more help and our parish ministries need more assistance. Every one of our liturgical ministries need increased membership – altar servers, proclaimers of God's Word, extra-ordinary ministers, music ministry and cantors and ushers/greeters. The family of Archangel Gabriel Parish needs to come together so we can share with the broader community that we do all we can to live out the mission of Jesus Christ!

The celebration of Ordinary Time comes to us in two phases, during the Winter and from the Summer into Autumn. The color of green welcomes growth and vitality. The first weeks after the Christmas Season focus on the call of Jesus to discipleship. This early part of the season acts as a bridge to Lent and the décor shows a gradual calming effect from the opulence of Christmas through the use of dark green leafy plants to the starkness of Lent when no flowers are permitted.

After the Easter Season, we continue to rejoice in the light as Spring turns into Summer. We also notice how the light begins to fade as Summer turns to Autumn. As the seasons change, so do our moods and perspectives. The Church environment should reflect that in supportive in simple ways with banners, living plants, etc. that reflect our times but don't distract from our prime focus or interfere with our prime focal points of the altar, ambo, and presider chair. Our patronal feast day is one of the highest celebrated and special attention with images, fabric, candles, etc. should be supplied. The commemoration of All Saints, All the Faithful Departed and the honoring of our parish patrons (Archangel Gabriel, Malachy, and Our Lady, Help of Christians) all should have some representation that respectfully gives them their due. Near the end of Ordinary Time, Thanksgiving Day should be simple, a continuation of the fall harvest theme coupled with gratitude.

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Sunday Gospel

Matthew 5:13-16

The widespread use of electricity in our society may make us less aware of the value and importance of light. To re-engage with the power of the metaphor that Jesus offers, gather your family in a darkened room. Bring only one flashlight.

Sit together for a minute and consider what you are able to do and see in so little light. You might try opening the Bible to see whether you can read today's Gospel. Turn on the flashlight and experiment to see how one might use it to achieve the greatest amount of light. Then read today's Gospel by the light of the flashlight. Ask everyone to consider what it means to say that Christians are to be the light of the world. How might your family act in a way that is a light for others, a light that is worthy to put on a lamp stand? Choose one thing that your family will do this week to show that you are the light of the world. You might choose to participate in an activity that your parish sponsors, such as help with a food pantry. Pray together by singing "This Little Light of Mine."

(Feast Day February 8)

c. 1869 – February 8, 1947



Josephine Bakhita is an African saint born in Sudan around 1869. She was kidnapped as a child, taken as a slave by Arab traders, and suffered a difficult life until her eventual freedom in Italy. Josephine's freedom came when she needed a temporary place to stay while her masters moved abroad without her. Her owners left her in the custody of the Canossian Sisters in Venice. There, she was baptized, confirmed, and received Holy Communion. Josephine eventually became a nun with the Canossian Daughters of Charity and lived and worked with them for 45 years.

Cooking Together: Parmesan Ranch Snack Mix

9 cups Corn, Rice, or Wheat Chex

2 cups miniature pretzels

2 cups miniature cheddar cheese Goldfish crackers
