A LEAP OF FAITH

We live in a city of bridges, the most of any city in the world outside of Venice, Italy. They take us over rivers and other impassable landscapes, so our lives are easier to manage. Many times, we don't think of how vital they are until they break or are blocked due to structural deficiencies. We are used to this in Pittsburgh. The physical bridge is almost a part of our DNA, connecting communities, or at least identifying them from one side to another. For us in Lent, how confident are we travelling our spiritual bridge from where we are to where we, or God, wants us to go? Do we trust who made this bridge? Who has been inspecting it? Does it need more maintenance? Are we willing to build trust for the bridge? Who will help us?

When we are faced with hard times that touch our heart and soul, many times our mind stalls out, not sure of what to do. This happens with death and with taking leaps of faith. Raising Lazarus from the dead goes beyond forgiveness and physical healing. The previous two great gospels in Lent shared how we can, and need to, include Christ in our rebuilding of relationships with each other by first doing so with the Lord. We are now invited into a deeper, divine love of God that wants to transform our human weakness into a holy communion with Him. With deep compassion and love, Jesus calls out to the Father, so that the people in grief will know the closeness of the divine that restores life when all else feels lost. The closeness of God! The love of God that truly touches us! The relationship with God that goes so deep in us that darkness is banished, and His light fills us!

We long so much for this experience to bring us lasting hope and belief in Him who saves us and in Him who cares for us every day. Trust the bridge Christ has built for you! Trust His hand as He reaches out for you! Trust yourself that you can travel over this spiritual bridge to Jesus! Realize that everything is possible with the Lord at our side, loving us, transforming us, redeeming us, as His very own beloved!

Please remember the Light is on for You this Wednesday evening from 6:00 to 9:00 PM with confession, Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, and our last Lenten Prayer Service at Holy Trinity Church.



DEVOTIONAL VOTIVE CANDLES

For many years, we have not increased the donation for votive candles at any of our Parish churches. However, due to increasing costs, we must now increase the requested donation. The donation amounts will now be consistent across the three church locations of Archangel Gabriel Parish. Therefore, effective Monday, March 27, the requested donation for the large, 6-day votive candles will be increased to \$4.00 per candle at all three church locations. Tenebrae Services

Tenebrae Services will be held at **5:00 AM** at **Holy Trinity Church on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.**

Translated as "darkness", Tenebrae is an ancient Catholic liturgy, traditionally celebrated before dawn on each day of the Triduum, that combines psalms from the midnight and early morning hours of the Divine Office. Only 15 candles light the dark church. After each psalm, one candle is extinguished while the congregation meditates on Christ's betrayal, death, and resurrection with readings selected for each day. Tenebrae ends with the strepitum, the "loud noise" to commemorate the earthquake that occurred when Jesus was crucified.

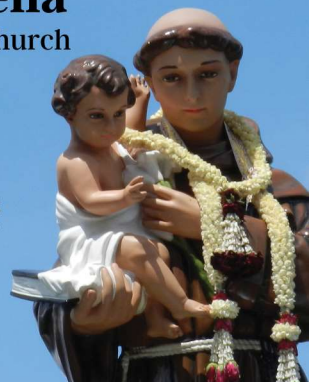

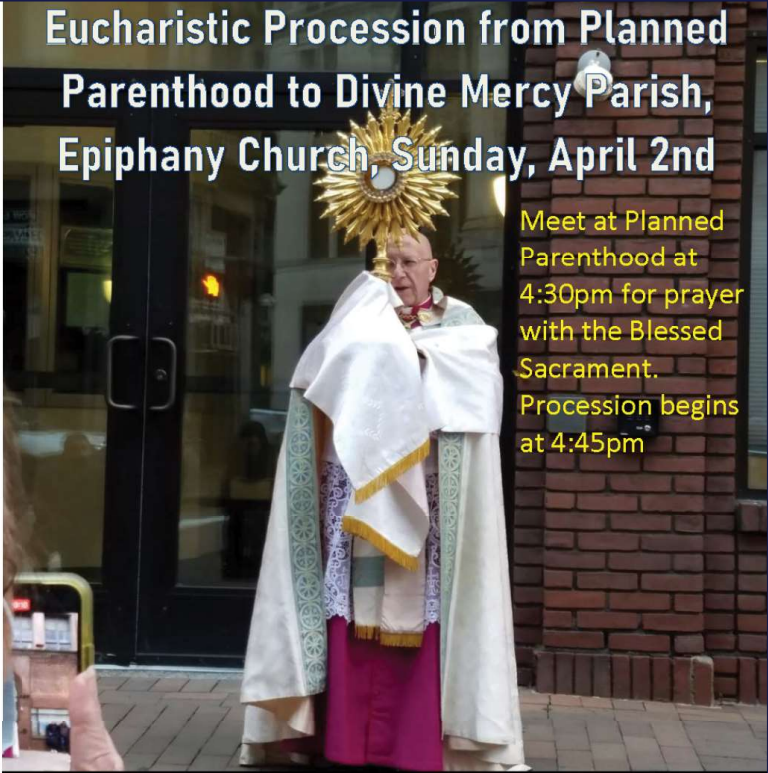

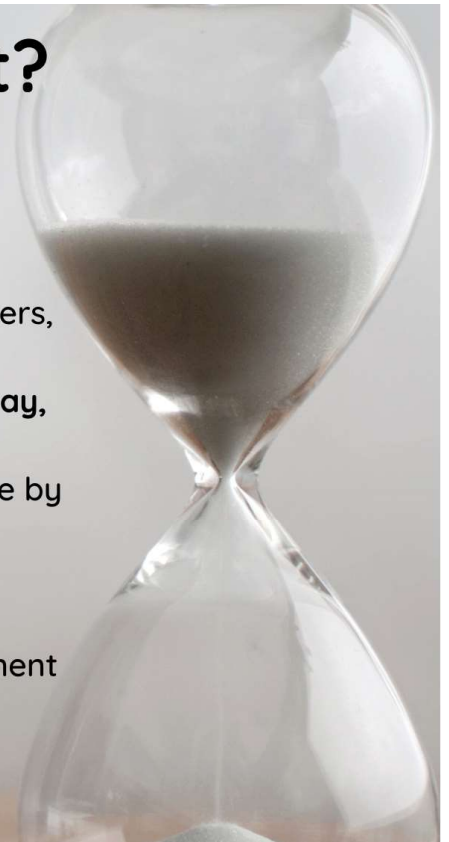

Fifth Sunday of Lent

The Sunday Gospel

John 11:1-45 (shorter version John 11:3-7,17,20-27,33b-45)

Jesus' promise of eternal life is a central element of our Catholic faith. Even though Easter is still two weeks away, our Gospel today invites us to acknowledge Jesus' power over death, evidenced in the raising of Lazarus, and to anticipate Jesus' conquering of death once and for all in his death and Resurrection. We sometimes use examples from nature to help describe this mystery of our faith. Jesus himself talked about the seed that dies when planted in the ground in order to produce new life (John 12:24). Using that image and others, we find hope and confidence in Jesus, the Resurrection and the life.

JESUS RAISES LAZARUS FROM THE DEAD.

Gather your family today and read today's Gospel in its shorter form, John 11:3-7,17,20-27,33b-45. Write Jesus' promise from today's Gospel ("I am the resurrection and the life.") on a large sheet of white paper. As your family talks about what Jesus means by this promise, decorate Jesus' words with symbols that will remind you of his promise of eternal life. Display this reminder of Jesus' promise in a prominent place in your home and keep it there until Easter. Pray that you will always remain confident in Jesus' promise of eternal life. Conclude by praying together the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed.

Martha, Mary, and their brother Lazarus were close friends of Jesus. Jesus frequently dined in their home. No doubt Martha was an active sort of person. On one occasion, she prepares the meal for Jesus and his friends and says what she thinks is obvious: All hands should pitch in to help with the dinner. However, Martha's moment of glory is her simple and strong statement of faith in Jesus after her brother's death. "Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world.'" (John 11:25-27)

Cooking Together: Lazarakia

This traditional Greek Lenten bread recipe will help to bring today's Gospel story to life!

2 lbs. unbleached, all-purpose flour
3/4 cup olive oil
1 cup cane sugar
2 packets active dry yeast
1-3/4 cups lukewarm water (plus a little more if needed)
1 tsp orange peel, one tsp cinnamon or a combination of both
1 tsp salt

Line two baking sheets with parchment paper. Mix all the dough ingredients and then knead well, until the batter becomes a nice soft dough. You may need to add a little extra water, depending on the quality of the flour. Cover and let the dough rest for about 15 minutes in a warm place.

Shape an egg-sized amount of dough into an oblong. For the hands, form two little ropes of dough and place them in an x-shape across the middle of the oblong. Form a third little rope into a circle and place it on top of the oblong for the head. Place two cloves in the middle of the head for eyes. Repeat the process with remaining dough.

Place the Lazarakia on the baking sheets and let rise in a warm place until doubled in size, about 1 hour. Bake in a preheated 350 F oven for 30-40 minutes, or until the bread rolls turn golden-brown.
