A MESSAGE FROM OUR CLERGY

IESUS, SHEPHERD OF OUR SOULS

How do little lambs become adult sheep? Growth. What type of growth? The one that learns. How do they learn? Through watching what the shepherd does and listening to what the shepherd says. It seems fairly simple, yet every discipline looks that way from the beginning. Communicating with our children requires a certain skill of consistency on their level of understanding. We have to translate what we know into words they can pick up and follow through with. Teaching by example is more demanding, because we are not used to every move we make and word we say being evaluated for its goodness. Therefore, the shepherd or parent has to be open to learning about themselves as well as how to be effective teachers.

Last weekend, we celebrated the first of six weekend masses with our children who are receiving their first Holy Communion. They look to us adults as the best

example of faithful Catholics, and they are eager to join us in receiving our Lord. Once we get past the special occasion of the "first time", the joy lasts for a while and the matter of routine creeps back in. Here is where our teaching meets its next challenge. If we are saying receiving the Body of Christ in the holy sacrifice of the Mass is the highest expression of faith, why do we let in other excuses for not attending, participating, and receiving on given weekends and Holy Days of Obligation?

Jesus is the gate and the Shepherd of our souls. He leads us faithfully into His promised pasture where all are fed with His love. After our children receive our Lord for the first time, our teaching responsibility does not end. It enters into a new phase of self-awareness, of witness, and of discipleship. We have to be just as eager as our children to learn from Christ, as they are from us. This calling is a continuation of our Easter joy. We are effective teachers when we choose to be receptive learners. Let's embrace this for our sake as well as for our children.





EXPLORING OUR FAITH

Fourth Sunday of Easter

The Sunday Gospel

John 10:1-10

Even though we have less experience with sheep and shepherds today in our society, we can still identify strongly with the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd and as the gate for the sheep. Psalm 23 remains a popular and favorite psalm for prayer. In the image of the Good Shepherd, we know ourselves to be protected and cared for by a loving God.

JESUS IS THE GATE FOR HIS SHEEP.

As your family gathers, ask what each person knows about sheep and shepherds. Recall that shepherds and sheep have a close relationship.

Sheep will only follow their own shepherd; they recognize his voice and will not follow a stranger. The shepherd's job is to protect his sheep. In some ways, the relationship between the shepherd and his sheep is like that of a parent and child. Read together this Sunday's Gospel, John 10:1-10. Talk about how Jesus tells us that he is the gate for the sheep. The sheep enter the protection of the sheepfold through the gate. In Jesus we find protection and abundant life. Conclude by thanking Jesus for being our Good Shepherd and by praying today's psalm, Psalm 23.

Fun Fact

Sheep are mentioned in the Bible more than 500 times, more than any other animal.

- What is it like to be one of Jesus' sheep?

Our Extended Family

St. Bernadette of Lourdes (Feast Day April 16) January 7, 1844 – April 16, 1879



St. Bernadette Soubirous was the first child of an extremely poor mill operator in the town of Lourdes in southern France. On February 11, 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary began appearing to Bernadette in a cave above the banks of the Gave River near Lourdes. She appeared to Bernadette 18 times in all. Although Bernadette's initial reports provoked skepticism, her daily visions of "the Lady" brought great crowds of curious people. The Lady, Bernadette explained, had instructed her to have a chapel built on the spot of the visions. The people were to wash in and drink the spring water that welled up from the designated spot. Lourdes has become one of the most famous Marian shrines in the world, attracting millions of visitors. Miracles have been reported at the shrine and in waters of the spring.

Cooking Together: Shepherd's Pie

This recipe will certainly remind you of today's Gospel!

- 1 pound ground round
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 jar spaghetti sauce
- 2 cups or more of French cut green beans (or other vegetables)
- Parmesan cheese
- Cooked mashed potatoes
- Butter
- Colby cheese
- Salt and pepper to taste

Fry up ground round with onions, garlic or whatever else you like! Put meat in baking pan and combine with spaghetti sauce. Make sure it's not too watery. Add French cut green beans or any other veggie you like. Sprinkle parmesan cheese on top. Glob on mashed potatoes and put some butter on top of the potatoes. Sprinkle on some Colby cheese. Bake at 350 F for 30 to 45 minutes. Let it sit for a few minutes before you dig in! Enjoy!


