A “New” Trend That is Ancient: There is a trend in the social media world that caught my attention. As I’m sure you experience, we are all surrounded by noise. Our phones, computers, television, streaming services, music, social media, emails, texts, and constant notifications (and spam phone calls) fill every second of our day. In this age defined by perpetual stimulation, where every moment is filled by a screen or noise, a new trend of embracing silence has emerged on social media as a rebellious act of digital detox. The idea is to deliberately face prolonged, potentially boring situations without the buffer of any entertainment. Basically, the trend is to see if you can handle silence. Often framed on social media as an exercise in mental toughness, this trend reflects a profound, universal human need for stillness.

While it sounds like a weird challenge for mental toughness, the trend shows that people are tired of being constantly “on.” When you stop feeding your brain the endless stream of dopamine from screens, you force yourself to just be. This uncomfortable moment of forced boredom actually leads to something positive:

a mental reset. When the filters are gone, your mind can finally process things, organize your thoughts, and when you just be you discover the Eternal Now (God).

This return to boredom (a.k.a. silence) is presented as a new radical idea in its quest to remove distractions. However, we have known through the Church’s consecrated silence, contemplative prayer, and Eucharistic Adoration how to achieve the peace being sought. For any of us to find peace, we must hear God personally speaking to us. Mysteriously, one of God’s favorite forms of speaking to us is silence. The core premise of the “new silence trend” is the intentional rejection of distractions to force a confrontation with one’s own mind. For us, the core premise is that in the silence we encounter God.

This desire for the unprotected experience of silence can find its spiritual truth in contemplative prayer. Rooted in the teaching of desert fathers and saints like Teresa of Ávila, contemplative prayer is not merely the absence of noise, but the intentional presence to God. Saint Teresa defined it as “a close sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with him who we know loves us.” The silence cultivated in this practice—whether through Centering Prayer or the contemplation stage of *Lectio Divina*—is not empty, but receptive. It is the necessary condition for hearing God over the noise of the world and one’s own preoccupations. When we enter contemplation we strip away distractions and worldly anxiety to rest directly in the loving gaze of the Divine. This spiritual purpose elevates boredom/silence from a mental task to a journey toward union with our creator and redeemer.

If contemplative prayer seems too difficult, here is the good news. The ultimate expression of this intentional stillness is Eucharistic Adoration. During Adoration, we sit in silence before the Real Presence of Christ. This is not meditation about God, but prayer to God, who is physically, sacramentally present. Adoration perfectly embodies the raw, immediate encounter at which the modern trend hints. It is the ultimate act of removing all filters, requiring the believer to simply be in the presence of the Lord. The silence of Adoration is a sacred space where one learns what theologians call the “Prayer of Quiet”—a state of simple, loving attention where conversation ceases and the soul merely gazes upon the God who gazes upon them. Here, the challenge of the social media trend—enduring boredom to find inner peace—is transformed into a profound act of worship, demonstrating that silence is not a void to be filled, but a divine sanctuary to be entered. The current trend validates the ancient wisdom of the Church, providing a providential point of connection for those seeking to transform a secular challenge into a holy and fruitful practice. In other words, if you know a person seeking this unprotected silence you know a person who you need to invite into the Catholic faith!

If you want to learn about prayer, we have the Prayer Lab. Need to ease into silent Adoration, we have the weekly Holy Hour (it has praise and worship style music intermixed with silence). The First Friday Family adoration is a time to introduce your children to Adoration in a more relaxed setting. You can stop into our churches to pay a visit to the Lord, with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament offered Monday through Saturday. Remember, you can also encounter God where you are when you silence yourself and enjoy the beauty of the created world. **Embrace silence and you will not find boredom, you will encounter love!**

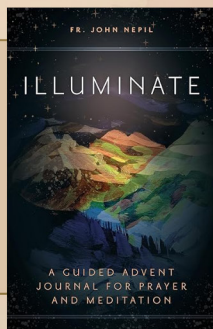

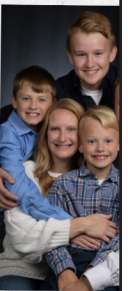

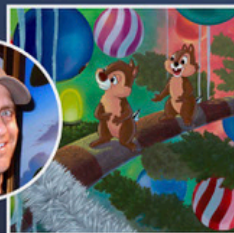
