St. Tim's Overseas Projects (STOP) provides grant funding to IRS-approved U.S. 501(c)(3) organizations that support human dignity and show our love for our global neighbors. Now in its 50th year, STOP has supported people around the globe through over 150 overseas projects. In 2023, over \$17,000 in STOP funds were distributed to projects in Uganda, Colombia, and El Salvador.

Are you connected to an organization that is working for integral human development in another part of the world that might benefit from STOP funding? Criteria for organizations applying for funding from St. Tim's Overseas Project:

- Located in a developing nation and have an office in the United States

- Fosters continued success
- Provides long-term change

Projects do not need to be explicitly Catholic or Christian in order to be eligible for STOP funding. The deadline for applications is December 31, 2023. Please note that checks will be made out to the organization, not to an individual.

Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother," and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam!
