



Confirmation



Below are prompts and questions for your own reflection as you consider writing for the Cornerstone.

Parishioners are invited to support our youth in this transformational, cross-cultural experience of serving others, developing relationships, and reflecting together on what it means to follow Jesus. The fundraising goal is \$7500. The cost is \$650/participant with youth participants providing \$295.
