Family Promise Anoka County (FPAC): Share the Promise



Stewardship Highlight: Proclaiming God's Word as a Lector at St. Timothy's

This is the third in a series of stewardship articles that features particular opportunities to serve in the ministries of the Church of St. Timothy. Service is an important pillar of stewardship along with prayer and generosity. Serving in our ministries is an enjoyable and rewarding experience, regardless of how you serve or how much time you have to dedicate to it.



The word liturgy means "the work of the people." The liturgy isn't just the work of the priest and deacon—the whole assembly actively participates in our common worship. Everyone contributes to the liturgy through prayer and the Eucharist.

Another way that parishioners can share their gifts and contribute to our liturgy is through serving as a lector. Lectors proclaim the weekend scriptural readings and Prayers of the Faithful during Mass. They also give the parish announcements before Mass. Through reading of the scriptures, our lectors are playing an important role in sharing God's message with us.

Lector Ryan Kolbeck shared that, "Proclaiming the word of God fills my heart with peace." Colleen Peppard, another lector in our parish family, added, "It is a privilege to be able to serve at St. Timothy's. I try to keep in mind that we are the hands and feet of Christ. Hopefully, the longer I serve, the longer I can truly understand what humility truly is so as to imitate Christ."

The church draws lectors from among our community to contribute to "the work of the people" by proclaiming the Scripture. You can sign up for a time that fits your schedule and participate as a lector for our liturgy at the Church of St. Timothy.
