Stewardship 2023: Celebrating God's Gifts, Responding Generously

There is much to celebrate as we look back on the past year in our parish community. With God's grace, we have continued to live our mission vibrantly: loving and serving our neighbors locally and globally; building community through our many ministries; forming children, youth, and adults in faith; and worshipping God through beautiful and reverent liturgical celebrations.

However, we also look back on the year aware of the challenges of this moment. On the reverse of this page is the annual financial report. Fiscal year 2022/23 ended with a \$-44,295 deficit. The current fiscal year's budget was approved by the parish finance committee (PFC) with a \$-91,139 budget deficit and included the following cuts to our expenses:

- The director of stewardship and development position was eliminated.
- Hours were reduced for the front office receptionists.
- Three full-time employees voluntarily agreed to take a four-week unpaid furlough to help reduce the parish's salary expense.
- There were no salary increases for any employees.

Even with these cuts, PFC members were not fully comfortable with the current fiscal year deficit amount. However, they recognized that any further budget cuts will significantly affect established parish ministries and programs. As good stewards, the parish simply cannot continue to pull from the reserve funds for regular operating expenses, particularly given significant maintenance expenses on the horizon.

The PFC acknowledged that we are at a crossroads as a parish. Those parishioners that are donating to St. Timothy's have stepped up and are giving more. For this, we are tremendously grateful. Yet the reality is that far fewer people are giving. In 2018, 1340 households donated to St. Timothy's. So far in 2023, 979 households have given. That's over a 25% decrease in five years. In addition, our expenses continue to increase. A February 2023 study of nationwide church giving pointed out that, adjusting collections for inflation, parishes have 11% less spending power than what they did in 2018. Most financial experts agree that is likely to continue and increase.

Balancing our budget each year is an important and proactive move to assure St. Timothy's can continue to be a vibrant and thriving parish for many years to come. To eradicate our deficit in the current fiscal year, we are asking all households to consider

donating a minimum of \$2 per week more. If you are able to give more, please do so. At the same time, the parish staff commits to continuing to keep our expenses down while looking at ways to encourage inactive parishioners to reengage with the parish. We thank you for all the ways that you contribute to our parish mission, and we give thanks to God for His goodness and fidelity to us all.


