The Church of St. Timothy, in the words of our mission statement, is “committed to outreach and peace.” Recognizing January 1 as a Day of Peace and the national celebration of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on January 19, our parish will pray a Novena for Peace from Saturday, January 17 through Sunday, January 25.

A novena is a long-standing Catholic practice of offering nine days of prayer for a specific intention.

Each year on January 1, the Pope offers a message about peace. Pope Leo XIV’s message for the 59th World Day of Peace is entitled, “Peace be with you all: Towards and ‘unarmed and disarming’ peace.” For our novena, we will read and reflect on short sections of Pope Leo’s message each day for nine days.
