

BRIEF SYNOPSIS OF SUNDAY READINGS

Pierwsze czytanie: Księga Przysłów 8:22-31

Paul says that we are now at peace with God through our faith in Jesus. We also hope to see the glory of God. This hope will not leave us disappointed because of the love God has shown in sending us the Holy Spirit.

Evangelio: Juan 16:12-15

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

“Jesus said to his disciples: ‘I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will speak not on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming.’”

We use our telephones to get directions. GPS is an essential item for so many. They provide security and ease to allow us to function. Each requires that we provide input. Did you ever observe a Seeing Eye dog? Arriving at a corner, he pauses and waits until a light changes, or traffic stops. His disabled person shows total dependence and moves forward, as he is led.

Jesus reminds us of the role of the Holy Spirit, whose coming we celebrated last week. That Spirit is to guide us, but requires that we pause, listen patiently, and then follow His prompts. Paul tells us that we are, ‘led by the Spirit...’ Do you pause and listen? Try it.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Something interesting happened last Saturday. Right before the evening Mass began, a family arrived for a special birthday celebration for their daughter, as is the custom in many Hispanic cultures. She was wearing a beautiful dress and many of the young men were dressed in traditional outfits. They had called the office and reserved the Mass intention for that night, but thought that doing so meant that they could have this ceremony and celebration at the Mass. I apologized for the misunderstanding but there wasn't much that I could do since it was 5:15 pm and Mass had to begin. Plus, I don't speak Spanish and didn't have any idea what is involved in doing this ceremony. I told them that they could stay and take some pictures in church after Mass was over, which they decided to do.

As I processed up the aisle of the church to begin Mass, I realized that God had offered a solution to our problem. As some of you know, last Saturday was my birthday. Some parishioners from my prior parish wanted to come to visit, attend Mass and then go out to dinner. Several weeks ago I had told them that I would probably be doing something with my family, but that it would be great if they came on Sunday instead. So, we set plans to do just that. As it turned out, my brother and I decided to go away for a couple of days to celebrate my birthday, Sunday after Mass into Monday. So, I called my friends and we changed things for them to come on Saturday as they originally wanted to do. Then, of course, something came up and the plans that my brother and I had needed to be cancelled, but I decided to leave things as they were with my friends.

Why am I telling you all of this? Well, it turns out that one of the people visiting from St. Denis is a deacon there...who speaks Spanish...and has done some of these birthday celebrations before. As I began to process out at the end of Mass, I motioned for him to join me and I explained the situation as we walked down the aisle. He immediately went into the sacristy to find an alb to wear and to get his thoughts together. He put together a short service and we were able to offer this family something for this special day.

If it had not been my birthday and if I didn't make plans to go away (even though they got cancelled) my friends wouldn't have been here that day and we wouldn't have had the ability to offer this family what we did.

I don't think that it's a stretch at all to see God's hand in this. He doesn't only take care of the big things in our lives, but also the smaller ones that are important to us...things like a special birthday celebration. He is present in so many ways throughout our lives...and throughout our days. Sometimes His presence can be obvious and at other times we have to make the effort to see Him there.

Let's all try to make that effort more often. It doesn't have to be in response to some problem that we are facing. God is actively present in so many aspects of our lives. Seeing Him there...realizing that He is around...can give us great comfort, in difficult times, as well as tremendous hope and peace, all the time. -Fr. Bob
