Maintenance Technician

PARISH CENTER RESTROOM RENOVATION

The accompanying "design development" document shows the floor plan for the parish center restrooms that are scheduled for renovation this fall. The restrooms, which will be expanded by moving the wall of the current classroom that gives access to them westward will have their entrance from the main hallway of the church, behind the stairwell to the 2nd floor. Both restrooms will be larger and make better use of the space available. They will also have changing tables, air dryers and be handicapped accessible. The classroom, which will still provide ample space for the kindergarteners and first-graders, will also have storage space for tables that are used in Hellmann Hall. The renovation is scheduled to begin around the first of October and should last six weeks. Children in religious ed. will be able to use the restroom on the 2nd floor while the first floor restroom are under construction.
