

Over the vears our enemies at large have included the Nazi regime, Soviet Union during the cold war era, Viet Cong. ISIS.

Possibly Jesus was addressing a more distressful enemy: those whom we personally know. and because of certain reasons or circumstances we have chosen to ignore, look down upon, scorn, disparage and sometimes simply hate their existence. With all good intentions in our daily endeavors, and the values of our Christian faith guiding us. Jesus understands the tendencies of our humanity and pride. (After all, he did take on our human traits and encountered a variety of individuals, desires, causes and suspicions.) Can we as Christians seek that deeper level of grace, however imperfect our desire, as Martin Luther King Jr. explains: "Now there is a final reason I think that Jesus says, 'Love your enemies.' It is this: that love has within it a redemptive power. And there is a power there that eventually transforms individuals. Just keep being friendly to that person. Just keep loving them, and they can't stand it too long. Oh, they react in many ways in the beginning. They react with guilt feelings, and sometimes they'll hate you a little more at that transition period, but just keep loving them. And by the power of your love they will break down under the load. That's love, you see. It is redemptive, and this is why Jesus says love. There's something about love that builds up and is creative. There is something about hate that tears down and is destructive. So love your enemies."

May Christ Jesus alone be our teacher in the inordinate grace possible within our humanity. "Teach me to feel another's woe, to hide the fault I see, that mercy I to others show, that mercy show to me." (Alexander
