

cant week of our Church year.

Holy Week, beginning with the reading of the passion narratives and blessing of palms on this Palm Sunday. Tuesday evening parishioners and visitors are again invited for the soup meal following the 5:15 p.m. Mass. Prior to the 7:30 a.m. Mass on Monday and Wednesday morning we will have guiet Adoration (no rosary or Stations) beginning at 6:30 a.m. If you have just a few minutes to spare or longer you are most welcome to pause and pray before the Blessed Sacrament. I will hear confessions prior to and after each Mass this weekend, before the daily Masses, and after Holy Thursday Mass and Good Friday Service.

Please bring your "Rice Bowl" offerings to church this week, placing it before the altar or in the collection. At our Holy Thursday Mass of the Last Supper we will bring forth the newly blessed Oils, (Oil of the Sick, Oil of the Catechumenates and the consecrated Sacred Oil); as tradition holds we will have the washing of the feet, the procession of the Blessed Sacrament after Communion and the 'stripping of the altar' (symbolizing our Lord's arrest and persecution). Of all the liturgies we gather for throughout the year our Good Friday Service is the most unique and solemn with the passion reading from John, and the reverencing of the cross. On Good Friday we are asked to refrain from eating meat, and fast with one proper meal. (A family shared with this particular form of fasting on this day which I continue to uphold personally: no TV, radio. computer, videos-essentially no noise-throughout the the day.) Easter Vigil Mass beginning at 8:30 p.m. will begin in darkness, and then celebrating the light of Christ with the reception of Braxton, Adam and Angela into our Catholic-Christian faith.

Our schedule for Easter Sunday will remain the same: 8 and 10 a.m. And may our church and parish be welcoming to anyone who desires to pray with us. to seek the presence of God, anyone who hopes to belong and find the grace of peace in their personal
