Last week while entering the church body on my way to the sacristy I noticed an elderly woman in a pew, silently present in prayer. A family member brought her to church, as she requested, to spend time alone in quiet prayer. She was limited in her ability to get around and had difficulty communicating because of various physical setbacks in the last couple of years. I recog-

nized her and waited until she finished her prayer or time of quiet contemplation. She was helped to her vehicle but not before we shared a very brief visit, and a gentle smile on her face. Considering her severe physical conditions and limitations, I was humbled to witness her quiet faith, her desire to be present to God, intimately and gratefully, in spite of all the physical setbacks that can make a 'normal' day

Reflecting on her quiet, resilient faith gave me pause to consider the day to day concerns and personal agitations pulling us away from the presence of God's grace before us. A myriad of distractions or commotions can divert our best intentions to remain focused with a Christian perspective. Her guiet witness of faith in a God who remains at her side is a reflection of an interesting prayer entitled. Prayer of an Anonymous Abbess:

Lord, thou knowest better than myself that I am growing older and will soon be old. Keep me from becoming too talkative, and especially from the unfortunate habit of thinking that I must say something on every subject and at every opportunity.

Release me from the idea that I must straighten out other peoples' affairs. With my immense treasure of experience and wisdom, it seems a pity not to let everybody partake of it. But thou knowest, Lord, that in the end I will need a few

Keep me from the recital of endless details; give me wings to get to the point.

Grant me the patience to listen to the complaints of others; help me to endure them with charity. But seal my lips on my own aches and pains -- they increase with the increasing years and my inclination to recount them is also increasing.

I will not ask thee for improved memory, only for a little more humility and less self-assurance when my own memory doesn't agree with that of others. Teach me the glorious lesson that occasionally I may be wrong.

Keep me reasonably gentle. I do not have the ambition to become a saint -- it is so hard to live with some of them -- but a harsh old person is one of the devil's masterpieces.

Make me sympathetic without being sentimental, helpful but not bossy. Let me discover merits where I had not expected them, and talents in people whom I had not thought to possess any. And, Lord, give me the grace to tell them so. Amen.

(As she left the church with the aid of a family member, with sadness I realized it would be for the last time this season as they travel back to their permanent home. At the same time I'm grateful our church and parish is a place where individuals and families feel welcome, finding the presence of God whether alone in prayer or within our Eucharist.)
