Reflecting on this Sunday, the Baptism of the Lord, we each have the blessing of godparents, living or deceased, who in their own way have graced our lives. Choosing a grandparent as one of the godparents was a common practice some years back, as well performing the Sacrament within days after the birth. Following the Vatican II Council By Fr. Tim Johnson



in the sixties, the Church emphasized the Sacrament of Baptism to take place during the Mass, allowing the parish to witness and support the newly baptized and family. However, the common practice now, at the parents' request—is to celebrate the Sacrament a month or longer after the birth. There is no definite time limit. As a parish, we welcome families who are requesting the baptism of an infant or child, encouraging their continued participation within our parish. I enjoy the baptisms taking place outside of Mass, allowing as many family members and relatives as possible to be present in a much more relaxed environment but no less sacred. We ask parents of their first born to attend a baptismal class beforehand, helping them to understand the Sacrament and the gift of faith guiding their family.

I extend my gratitude for Holly Skopec's time and efforts as a member of our Parish Finance Board. She completed her second term on the board, offering good advice and direction over the past six years. I have asked Marcy Wittrock to serve on our Finance Board with her three year term beginning this month.


