

Next week the Presentation of the Lord Holy Day falls on Sunday (the 2nd). Through the years this day has been referred to as Candlemas, reflecting the European custom of long processions with candles leading up to the Mass. Such a practice is biblically based on the words of Simeon who held the infant Jesus and proclaimed, "a light

for revelation to the Gentiles." As custom holds, local parishes offer parishioners "blessed candles" on this holy day as a symbol of Christ Jesus' protective light in their homes. Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the temple, forty days after his birth as custom dictated for her ritual purification following childbirth, and to perform the redemption of the firstborn son, in obedience to the Torah (Leviticus 12, Exodus 13:12-15). (And this feast day happens to be the half way point between the shortest day and the Spring Equinox.)

On the heels of "Candlemas" is the feast day of St. Blaisé, Feb. 3rd. As custom holds we will have the blessing of the throats before and after the Masses next weekend, the 1st and 2nd. A distinctive blessing within our Catholic faith that is centuries old, stemming from certain beliefs in the life of St. Blaise. Of what little we know of this early century saint, he was ordained a bishop serving in Armenia with a keen interest in medicine. Apparently he was called upon to heal individuals suffering from objects stuck in their throat. My memory of this distinctive blessing goes back to my childhood, standing in a long line with all the other Catholics, adults and children, waiting to have our throats blessed by Fr. Phillips our pastor. I still hold this blessing as a healing grace for those who receive it.

Though I'm a month behind, thank you for your cards, kind words, gifts and prayers this past Christmas. Your thoughtfulness and faith allowed this Christmas to be grace-filled, though the holy day fell smack dab in the middle of the week. Always a source of gratefulness to preside in this beautiful church with the music, decorated sanctuary, hospitality of the volunteers at our four Masses on Christmas. I pass on a thank you from Cherish Center for your generosity this past fall (through the baby bottle donations), receiving nearly \$1600 in donations.

Along with the other Catholic parishes of our lakes region, the men are invited to participate in the upcoming CHRP/Welcome retreat on Feb. 22/23. Through the efforts of a group of men preparing to lead the retreat and guiet donors, there is no cost. A golden opportunity to take a step back and renew the grace of our personal faith that may have been taken for granted.
