

tice of faith have been interrupted these last three months, with the hope of "normalcy" a relative term. As our diocese slowly reopens parishes with guidelines and expectations, the adjustments are so evident. With masks worn, distancing within and between pews, Communion offered at the end of Mass, and far fewer individuals present in church, we recognize changes that have taken place. Safeguarding our parishes and facilities is one matter, but the sharing in the Eucharist is another. What remains unaltered, unchanged, is the Eucharist, the real presence. At the same time, our prayers in the liturgies—spoken, sung, quiet reflection—concur a consistency with the Eucharist alongside the faces and lives of those present—ever evolving and yet unchanged in principle. We are blessed with the Sacraments which connect us to our past, places us in the present grace of Christ, and guides us to the light before us. Patiently and hopefully our mission as St. Joseph Catholic Parish will thrive and evolve, drawing us closer to the peace of Christ. Welcome back! In respect to these last three months of uncertainty and the altering of our

social lives, Condoleezza's words ring true: "That it

doesn't matter where you came from, but where you

are going." We will continue with our 'summer schedule' of weekend Masses, with our daily Masses opening up after the Fourth weekend. Without change, the weekday Masses will follow the same diocesan guidelines: masks worn, distancing in and between pews, Communion at the end of Mass. However, at weekday Mass. I'm asking each person to 'sanitize' their respective area before leaving. As we move back to 'reopening' daily Mass for the public, I'm looking at a 7:30 a.m. schedule, Monday thru Friday. During Lent we would move the Tuesday Mass back to 5:15 p.m. with our Lenten Soup meal to follow. Realizing how difficult it is to have at least one person assigned for one particular hour during the 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Adoration. I would have this special prayer time in some form as we do at present: two hours, one or two days. a week. Times and days are not set in stone by any means. We will continue offering the Anointing Mass every other month at a 7:30 a.m. Mass.

We are setting First Communion in late July, Sunday the 26th, at 1 p.m. Families have been contacted and Sharon with Faith will have the families participate in a workshop prior to that Sunday. Confirmation will take place at St. Mary's Parish (as originally scheduled before the restrictions), most likely in late summer or

early fall. Again, nothing set in stone at this point but hoping to re-establish a presence of community within our parish, our liturgies, and our activities. We have to keep in mind the diocesan guidelines and our efforts to safeguard the wellbeing of individuals who feel welcome here.

Our parish office is open but we ask that you call ahead, and when coming into the office space, or to visit Sharon or Cain, please be aware of social distance, and wear a mask—efforts to safeguard our staff and others. Our clothing room will remain closed through the summer months and most likely longer depending on the severity of the coronavirus. As always, thank you for your patience and understanding. Because of the virus spiking in our region, we are keeping our Parish hall closed to activities and gatherings for a certain time.

As we celebrate our country's Independence this weekend. I leave you with a quote from President Johnson: "This, then, is the state of the union: free and restless, growing and full of hope. So it was in the beginning. So it shall always be, while God is willing, and we are strong enough to keep the faith." Blessings to you this Fourth of July, for your safety, your hope going forward, and a spirit of gratitude for the freedoms we have received, especially the practice of our Christian faith and the virtues reflecting our character. God is willing!
