Long has managed a great crew of volunteers who work all year round to keep this important outreach in good order. We want to welcome Mary Lou Schroeder back to St. Joseph. Mary Lou has volunteered to sort and categorize all contributions. We want to thank all of our past and present clothing room volunteers. I am amazed by the continuous procession of folks who come to St. Joseph's for their special clothing needs. Recently we have decided to change the hours that the clothing room will be open. Beginning on June 1, the clothing room will be open to the public from 1 to 4 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday afternoons and on Friday morning from 9 to 12 noon. As in the past, the room will not be open on Wednesdays. The clothing room will be supervised during the hours that it is open to the public. We ask that all contributions to the clothing room be delivered during business hours and please, do not leave contributions outside the doors of the building. Signs inside the main corridor will direct you where to leave your contrutions. Thank for all who help to make this project an important outreach to the needy of the area.

Tower Restoration

We have begun work on the restoration of our monumental tower. The wooden soffit and facia at the top of the tower have begun to deteriorate and need to be replaced, the lights on the cross do not function properly and the screens on the tall louvers are broken allowing birds and bats to get into the tower and into the attic of the Church. Nearly four years ago, a portion of the choir loft ceiling collapsed. The large hole in the south loft ceiling will be repaired and repainted. The two tower rooms are in bad repair and mold needs to be removed. These necessary repairs will take two weeks or so. To protect all from falling debris, we are going to close off the front porch for two weeks. Please use the west entrance for the next two weeks.
