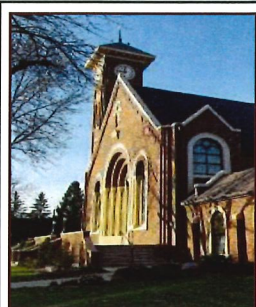

A Long-Range Plan For Our Parking Lot

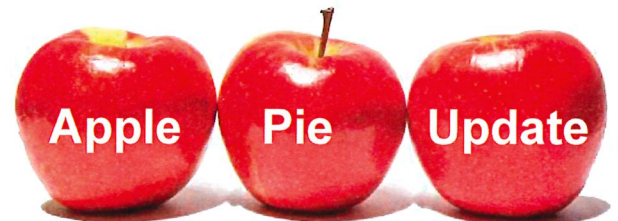
As many have observed the entrance to our parking lot along 13th Street/A34 is in serious need of repair. Recently the City of Milford officials let us know that in the near future work will be undertaken to widen 13th Street. The work that the city will be undertaking will demand that we address the entrances to our parking lot. In addition, some portions of our existing parking lot blacktop have begun to deteriorate making snow removal difficult and in places, creates walking hazardous. New, more controlled entrances will allow us to create better flow patterns for those arriving and departing from our parking lot on busy Sunday mornings. While the city's street plan is still in the discussion/planning stages, we know that we will eventually have to make the necessary improvements to both our parking lot and our frontage along our 13th/A34. The cost of the work to be undertaken will be significant so we need to start planning for this large expenditure so that we are not caught off-guard when the time comes to take on the project. Recently we received a contribution from a family that we would like to set aside as seed money for this upcoming project. We want to begin a kind of mini-capitol campaign so that we can work toward a goal that will certainly be well into six figures. Each quarter we will attach a special campaign envelop to your regular special collection's envelopes. We hope that you will all consider a regular gift to help us meet this obligation when the time comes. The people of St. Joseph Church have always risen to the challenge of keeping our buildings and grounds in great shape. In advance, I thank you for assisting in this long-range vision to keep our St. Joseph campus beautiful.
