





Both St. Mary's and St. Joseph's are busy places. We have wonderful facilities and sometimes scheduling gets to be a problem. All of our rooms are used by multiple groups and individuals throughout each month. Some groups meet every week and some events happen only once or twice each year. Maintaining a clear and concise calendar of events is often a challenging task. Please make sure that you notify the parish offices to reserve a room for your group or event. Please do not assume that because you "have always used" a particular part of our facilities that your usual space will be available. We are always happy to make our church facilities available to parish members but please, remember that you MUST reserve our facilities before you schedule a meeting or event.

Summer Mass Schedule

We are looking forward to warmer weather and we are anticipating increased attendance at our weekend Masses. Our "Summer Mass Schedule" begins on the weekend of May 20-21. Beginning the third week in May we will celebrate Mass at St. Mary's at 5:30 p.m. on Saturdays and at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays. At St. Joseph's we will be adding two Masses each weekend; the schedule will be 4 p.m. on Saturday at 7 a.m., 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. on Sundays. Thank you for your kind hospitality to our many guests.

Weddings and Funerals

We are beginning our busy wedding schedule. Between our two parishes we have an average 18 to 25 weddings each year. Brides and grooms schedule these important events well in advance of their great day. We have a long-standing policy not to schedule funerals on the days of weddings. Wedding parties make use of our whole facilities on a wedding weekend. Families are asked to keep this in mind when it is necessary to choose a date for the funeral of a loved one. Your funeral director will work with the clergy and the parish offices to schedule all funerals.

Cemetery Decorations

As we look forward to Memorial Day, we are conscious that we want our cemeteries to look their best. We have a number of families who have left plastic flowers, decorations and other memorabilia on graves throughout the cemetery. We ask all families to please remove all decorations that have been left there throughout the winter and remember that we have a long-standing policy that all Memorial Day decorations MUST be removed from cemetery plots by June 12th, two weeks after Memorial Day. It is very difficult for our maintenance crew to work around decorations that are left on the ground around family graves. Elevated pot holders are permitted if they are anchored directly beside a grave marker or stone. Please recall that our cemetery is closed between dusk and dawn each day.
