Redeemable Cans and Bottles

I would like to thank the many people who faithfully deposit their used and redeemable cans and bottles in our large trailer on the west side of our property. I know that there are many folks who contribute to that small effort and we want to express our gratitude. Every once in awhile I have volunteered to help sort and bag everything in preparation for transport to the redemption center. It is a sloppy and smelly job. Even after a shower I smelled like stale beer. Just a couple of reminders for all who bring cans and bottles to our bins:

- 1) If possible, please rinse the bottles and cans before bringing them to us for redemption.
- 2) Please bag or box all cans and bottles. When cans and plastic bottles are placed loose in the bins they have a tendency to blow all over the yard.
- 3) We currently are not able to redeem any kind of glass beverage bottles. Even if you have paid the deposit on glass beverage bottles the local redemption center is not equipped to receive glass. We must separate out all glass containers and recycle them ourselves. Please do not bring any glass beverage containers to our recycling bins
- 4) Please do not place kitchen or household garbage in the bags or boxes that you bring to our recycling bins. Each week we find ourselves sorting through household garbage to sort out cans and bottles. Again, thanks for making the effort to bring your redeemable plastic and metal beverage bottles to us. We were able to recoup more than \$10,000 last year from this effort. Every bit of the funds that are raised through out redemption project goes to support our various youth ministry projects.
